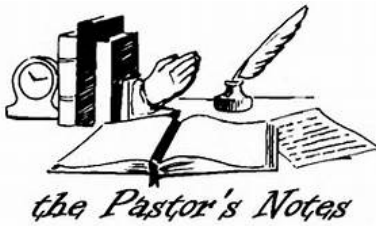

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time C-2016

My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

In today's Gospel message, Jesus speaks of a personal God whom we address as *Father*. We approach the Father with reverence and rely on Him for food. We ask that He will treat us as we treat others; we ask for what we need and trust the Father to give us only what is good. There is so much here that we often take for granted but how different it is from a pagan way of looking at the world.

There is one God, we believe, not many gods. God is concerned with the affairs of every human being. His provision for people is rooted in His love for them and is His free gift. He is not controlled by worshippers, nor does He have to be appeased by ritual actions or good behavior and His oversight is providential, so that we are able to trust in the goodness of whatever He does. God is not capricious or arbitrary.

To the Christian, the distinction is clear. Whatever the attraction of pagan cults, they are not comparable to the Christian way. The challenges they pose are none the less valid and need to be taken seriously. The hungry soul will dine where it may.

We live in a world where we, as Christians, are challenged in so many ways. We need to rediscover the message at the heart of the Gospel; that Jesus comes to reconcile us to our loving God from whom we have separated ourselves. We can learn again the simple reliance on God which our sophisticated lives can often hide. Who we are and what we achieve depends partly on ourselves but it depends so much more on our openness to God's transforming grace.

We can regain our closeness to God's creation, using wisely, justly and well, the resources of the earth. In this, we realize that there can be no separation between peace and harmony in body and soul and peace and harmony in the world around us. We can be slow to criticize new religious movements and cults because we will be conscious of where we, as Christian Communities, fail to serve the spiritual needs of many people.

We can continue to examine our hierarchies, our worship, customs and laws, in light of the Gospel, to weed out tendencies that are contrary to the ways of Christ. My brothers and sisters, our constant aim is to love and serve God as well as our neighbor. Rediscovering in the teaching of Jesus the simple truths of the Gospel, is an end which is good in itself. It also enables us to help those who are lost, confused, dissatisfied, spiritually hungry, or poor. There are clearly lessons for us to be learned.

KEEP PRAYING

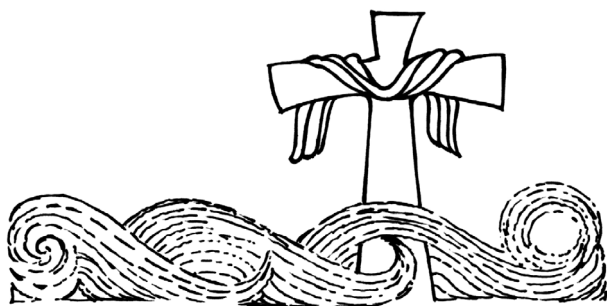
St. Monica, whose feast we celebrate in August, is often known as "the persistent mother." She watched her oldest son, Augustine, turn his back on his Christian faith.

Monica was exasperated. For years she gave up talking directly to her son on the advice of a local bishop, who told her that it was better to talk to God about Augustine than to Augustine about God.

The mother never gave up praying for her son. Eventually Augustine gave up his wild ways, was baptized, and later ordained and named bishop of Hippo. St. Augustine went on to become one of the Church's greatest scholars.

Today's readings address the importance of persistent prayer. Abraham, in spite of trepidation that he is bothering the Lord, continues to ask about the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah. Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, tells his disciples to "ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). This is our charge: keep praying.

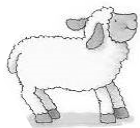

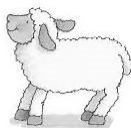
