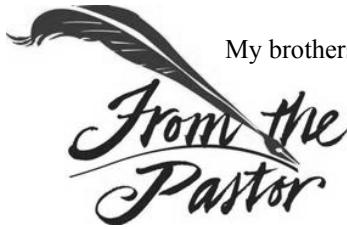

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!



During his time as our Holy Father, and more than any other Pope, Blessed Saint John Paul II travelled the globe in exercise of his pastoral ministry, seeking to bring hope and encouragement to people by sharing with them the Gospel message. One of the features of his visits to these places was the profound respect he showed to a country by symbolically kissing the ground upon his arrival. That kiss was a sign of love, not for the land itself, but for its culture, its history, its values, and most of all, its people. All of us are very attached to our nation, our home, our country, and to honor our land is to honor us. This simple and loving gesture by Pope John Paul II made us feel all included.

It is said that during the time of Jesus, when Jews were living abroad and returned home to Israel, their first action was to show respect for the land. They did this not by kissing the ground but, rather, by wiping the dust off their sandals, so that the Holy Land would not be contaminated with the dirt of foreign lands. Jesus understood the need for His disciples to respect the people and places they visited. They were to speak the words of peace and accept whatever hospitality was offered to them. He instructed them to care for the people, cure their illnesses and give them the message of hope that, "God's kingdom is near to you." As we heard in the Gospel, if they were not welcome, they should shake the dust off their feet. By encouraging them to do this, Jesus was telling His disciples to let the rejecting towns know that they were not part of the new people of God, the new Israel. They had excluded themselves from what God was trying to do. They were worse than the people of Sodom who also refused to offer hospitality to God's messengers. And yet, even here the disciples are to insist on their message that *God's kingdom is near*.

To those who welcomed them, the message would be good news. To be close to the kingdom of God means that God is our King, our ruler. It means that we can expect God to be active in our relationships, in our communities. It means that we can experience the peace which comes from being close to God. It means that we can expect God to hear our prayers, to heal our wounds and hurts, to forgive our sins and failings. It means living in the hope of eternal life. And it means having a living relationship with our God who is a loving Father.

To those who reject them, the message of the Gospel and the news that God's kingdom is not a consolation but rather a warning or an admonition to change one's heart, as well as to repent, becomes a challenge to be part of God's kingdom. Accept God's message, accept this opportunity for your salvation, allow God to enter your life, to heal and to give hope. Allow Him to make you part of His people, part of His kingdom. Otherwise there is no future for you.

Today's message is an invitation to become part of God's kingdom and to allow God to rule in our hearts, in our attitudes and values, as well as in our choices and lifestyle, relationships and communities. We need to let God be our king, let His love guide us and only then will we realize His peace and join in the fullness of life which He offers each one of us.

On behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco and I, we wish you a happy 4th of July celebration. Please be safe in your travels to and from your destinations.

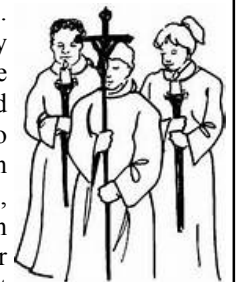
