



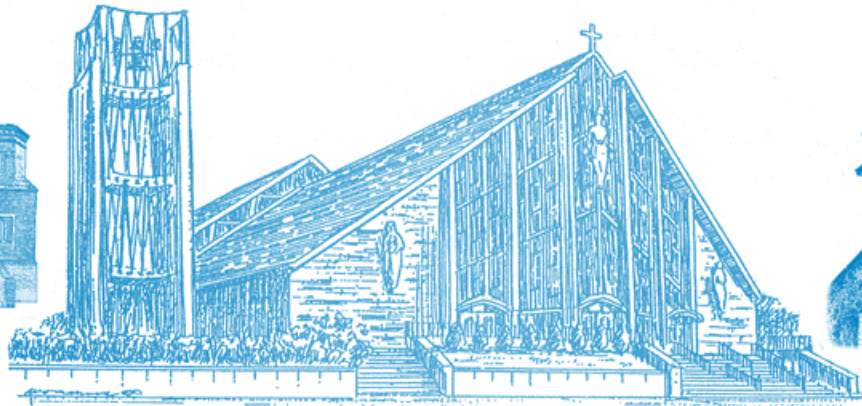

### 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 2016-C

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today's Gospel passage is something all of us have either experienced or have witnessed, at one time or another, as family and friends face this challenge. We see two brothers arguing over money and family inheritance. One of them vocalized his complaint and anger to Jesus, demanding justice and wanting it immediately. Our Lord hears the request but is very clear that He has no intention of getting involved in a family argument. It is not His place to go around and dispense justice in the lives of others; there are people appointed in society to do that very thing, be they judges or mediators. But we see that Jesus does not miss the opportunity to tell the brothers and whomever else who cares to listen, that the big issue here is not who gets what, but how important it is to preserve the security of life that comes from loving one another. Security of life is a spiritual reality that enfolds us when we are enfolded in love by family and friends and when we learn to allow ourselves to be embraced by the love of God. Money does not do it.

To bring this truth home, Jesus tells a story in which the only characters are a rich farmer and God. There is no one else in this story. The farmer has a big problem and wonders how he can keep all of his wealth for himself. He decides to build a bigger barn and store it all; he will then sit back, pour himself a drink and relax. He thinks he will no longer have problems or worries; everything will be perfect. But what is really happening is that this man is only talking and listening to himself, until God insists on being heard. Death comes and all is left behind.

Greed of any kind will kill us. Greed does not want to know about anybody else. Greed will foul up friendships and causes family lives to separate and hold anger as well as grudges. Wanting everything for yourself and wanting your own way in everything is a high road to misery. Today Jesus warns us about the excessive desire for wealth or gain and not justice, love of money or possessions, but the selfish desire to arrange the world exactly how it suits you and nobody else. Jesus clearly states that our security is not achieved by what we have or what we possess. Our security is maintained by the kind of people we are and try to be. Saint Paul tells us today to *strip off your old self and old behavior*. He tells us to put on Christ. And if you want to be rich, be rich in God!

#### **Below is a letter, issued by the Archdiocese, responding to the recent *We Are Living Stones* attack:**

Many of you, I am sure, have received a flyer this week purporting to come from *Parishioners of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church* in Montclair. This action, on the part of the writers, is the latest step in this group's effort to continue a campaign of misinformation and disinformation about the upcoming merger of this parish with Immaculate Conception Parish in September. The new parish is to be called St. Teresa of Calcutta.

The formal decree, establishing the merger, is to be made public very soon in both parishes. Stated plainly in the Archbishop's decree is the following: "In fact, as a result of this amalgamation, it is my intention that the Churches of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Immaculate Conception both keep their original names and remain open for as long as it is possible and beneficial to its members." Please know then that the claim the group is making about Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church closing is not true. Also know that the individuals behind this campaign are claiming that the Archdiocese has been conducting, "under false pretenses," the *We Are Living Stones Campaign* to benefit parishes. They claim that funds raised from parishioners at Our Lady of Mount Carmel are not going to the parish but will be assumed by the Archdiocese. This claim also is not true.

Their claim only demonstrates that the leaders of this group (headed by the former business manager of the parish) have no idea about the mechanics or purpose of *We Are Living Stones*. Further, their actions and desire to spread untruths through tactics such as this most recent flyer mailing are seeking to deny to your parish the benefits you are receiving under *We Are Living Stones*. Sadly, those who are seeking to disrupt *We Are Living Stones* are also acting in violation of Canon Law. Remember that once your parish reaches its Works of Mercy goal under *We Are Living Stones*, one-half of all funds collected are returned to your parish so that it can accomplish the plans and initiatives that have established under the campaign.

As of July 21, *We Are Living Stones* has achieved an impressive \$72 million in pledges and contributions, received to date, have totaled more than \$22 million. To date, more than \$8.2 million has been pledged to the Works of Mercy portion of *We Are Living Stones*, which has benefited Archdiocesan ministries. Those ministries include, among many: Catholic Charities; Youth and Young Adult Ministries; Archdiocesan-wide programs to promote Family Life, greater respect for human life and social justice; and hospital and prison chaplaincies.

Nearly \$24 million has been committed to the Archdiocesan trust funds for Tuition Assistance to Catholic Schools, Parish Renewal, Seminarian Support and Retired Priest Care and Medical Costs. These trust funds will provide assistance to all parishes and schools, and thus strengthen the Archdiocese in the years to come.

Another nearly \$4.5 million received to date has been distributed directly into parish accounts to support the projects each parish has outlined in its Case statement, with another \$30 million pledged. Disbursements are scheduled quarterly and are based on funds collected.

Every priest knows what his parish has received to date to support his Case statement and many have already begun some of those projects. They know how *We Are Living Stones* is benefiting, on a grass-roots level, the people and institutions of this great Archdiocese, and we trust they are keeping their parishioners informed as well.

#### Pastor's Desk, continued:

In the case of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, we simply want to inform you that, to date, contributions to *We Are Living Stones* have reached \$54,371 of the \$98,900 that parishioners have pledged. The parish has satisfied its Works of Mercy goal of \$17,000, and \$18,866 has been deposited in its parish account to fulfill the work outlined in its Case statement. All remaining contributions that come from the parishioners of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, who continue to honor their pledges, will continue to be allocated in this same fashion and will continue to help realize the plans outlined by them for the buildings and programs that will become part of the new St. Teresa of Calcutta parish this September.

Parish Pastors will provide members of their parish community with all of the updates about *We Are Living Stones* and how it is working in their parish. A volunteer review committee of parishioners and clergy from throughout the Archdiocese is reviewing all *We Are Living Stones* disbursements to ensure transparency and accuracy in the program.

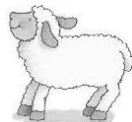
