







MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

This week-end we celebrate Columbus Day and, once again, I am grateful to the Knights of Columbus for this annual celebration in bringing our community together beginning with holy Mass and dinner following. We congratulate Gina and Alex Tamburri on their reception of the *Santa Maria Medal* and we say thank you to our heavenly Father for the special gift they are to our community; giving their Time, Talent and Treasure of Heart as true Stewards in our faith community. Their hard work in putting together our annual Italian Festival as well as all the behind-the-scenes time they spend in caring for our Parish community. Through the intercession of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, may they be blessed with good health and happiness. Sincere thanks to the K of C for all their effort in putting this celebration together. We are also blessed with the presence of the Carabinieri who have come from Italy to join us in celebration.

In today's Gospel we hear that Jesus is making His way to Jerusalem. Whenever this is mentioned, it is to remind us that He is approaching the place of His passion, death and resurrection. He is in border territory between the Jewish province of Galilee and the land of the Samaritans, a people whose hatred of the Jews was reciprocated. It is here that He meets a group of lepers who have come together to beg. This would be their only means of livelihood as they would be forced to keep away from other people. Not only was leprosy considered an infectious disease, but it was thought that sufferers had to have offended God and so they were shunned. Touching a leper would mean to be defiled, made ritually unclean. It was only when the Messianic Age arrived that lepers would be healed and leprosy be no more.

The lepers in today's Gospel passage ask Jesus for mercy, translated into alms or food. But Jesus gives them more than that; He heals them. They respond at once to His instruction to show themselves to the priests as people healed of a disease, even before they are sure that He has the power to heal them. Jesus does the healing and they have cooperated, not made fun of the incredible implication of what He is asking them of them. They are, of course, ecstatic about what has happened to them. Their whole lives have been turned around in an instant. They are now free, whole and healthy. Yet we see that only one of them appreciates the gift that had been so generously given to them. And this is a Samaritan, one of those despised people. There he is, alone of the ten, humbly falling on his knees in front of Jesus and thanking God. His healing draws him to Jesus and, for this faith, Jesus assures him that he is now not only healed but saved, and he is promised a place in the kingdom of God.

Obviously, Jesus expects gratitude and He is disappointed at the ingratitude of the other nine. Being grateful is good for us. It helps, if only partially, to restore balance as well as to bring justice to the situation. It opens us up to one another, it deflates pride; it acknowledges that the other is worthier than we are. It is the mark of true humility that we can be sincerely grateful to a benefactor, to anyone who has done us a favor or service. When you think about it, from a very early age parents and other significant persons in our lives have taught us the words *please* and *thank you*. And yet, there are times when it is difficult for us to be grateful. How forgetful we are of all the good things that come our way.

My brothers and sisters, we might realize that a grateful heart is not made overnight but is the outcome of daily appreciation and thanksgiving to God for every moment of life, for every occasion of happiness, however slight or swiftly it passes us by. We might ask ourselves: *how grateful are we are for the kindness of others, the beauty of nature, the blood in our veins and the love of our God*. Let us aspire to be grateful people, as the Samaritan, and not be like the other nine.




What is the Neo-Catechumenal Way?

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniqualvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5th century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

All one needs to do is come and LISTEN, and you will experience how good is the Lord.
