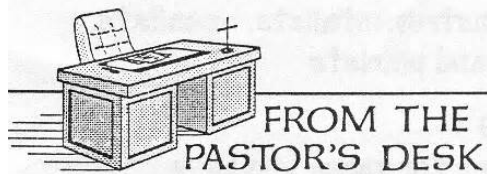

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus tell His followers that He *has come to bring fire to the earth*. He describes the divisions that will happen, even within close knit families. Jesus presents the inevitability of discussions that may or may not lead to actual conflict. What He does not do, however, is offer disagreement that automatically causes the breakdown of family life. In speaking of religious belief, Jesus refers to something that touches the deepest part of a person's soul which is the personal relationship with God. This is such an important part of life and people can get worked up about it. If our understanding of God was not so important and was only a trivial matter, it would not cause such hostility among people. Jesus recognized this, foreseeing that even within His own lifetime His words would lead to dissention and to His own betrayal, His torture and His death on the cross. Sometimes the different understanding of the Gospel message would become brutal and yet might only represent differing interpretations of the same word. Difficulty in finding common language has separated Catholics and Orthodox Churches since the Great Schism of 1378. That is why, under the leadership of Pope Francis and the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Bartholomew I, huge efforts are being made to rediscover a shared language and understanding of God's work in our midst. Jesus recognized that the Gospel, at times, would lead to discord. However, with good leadership, a new and enriched unity and understanding is entirely possible.

My brothers and sisters, there is a proverb which declares, "Mighty oaks from little acorns grow." In recent years, huge strides have been made in ecumenical and interreligious dialogue. It is unlikely that we will see full Christian unity in our own lifetime, but *unity* does not necessarily mean believing in the same things. However, it does mean working together in peace. Little by little, our efforts to speak to each other are making a world of difference.

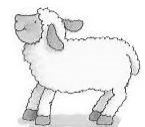
