MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:



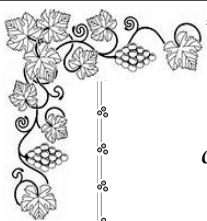
The judge in today's parable, described by Jesus as having "neither fear of God nor respect for man," is unconcerned about the widow's plea for help. Yet, as an elder and local judge, he would have known that the religious law directed him to lay aside the rule of impartiality in favor of the widow, orphan and stranger. It is only the widow's persistence in demanding justice that makes him give in. He does so not for the sake of justice but, rather, to save himself from being pestered.

The poet Tennyson wrote, "More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of." The parable is about the power of prayer as well as the need to pray continually and never lose heart. The poor widow is an example for anyone whose life has entered into darkness: she persevered and refused to give up. The unjust judge, whatever his motive, finally acceded to her pleadings and, to that degree, at least he changed. Jesus compares the judge's reaction to God, who sees justice done to those who cry out to Him; even if He delays in answering those prayers. The unjust judge delayed through indifference. Why God sometimes delays in answering our prayers is unknown to us in this life but it may be that by going through such time of waiting that God helps us to change into a closer union with the crucified and risen Christ.

The Scottish poet, Tessa Ransford, in her book of poems, "Shadows from the Greater Hill," addresses two young trees uprooted and replanted. Ransford wrote, "You must explore the dignity you dwell in, hold to purpose, keep direction, it will pass, this injustice; and you will have grown." It is the same for us when we pray, for God will see that, in the end, all will be well and that through the experience we shall grow. We must remember that the more we persevere in prayer, the stronger our faith becomes.

Once again, I want to thank our Knights of Columbus, under the direction of Grand Knight Steve Picciano, Sr., for a wonder celebration and dinner in acknowledging and honoring Alex and Gina Tamburri for all their hard work and, most especially, their love for our parish of Holy Family. Everything was perfect. Many thanks to all who worked behind the scenes to make the celebration such a great success.

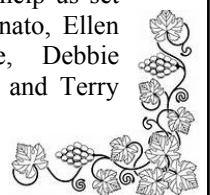

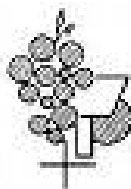

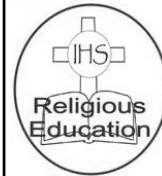


RCIA Invitation

What is the Neo-Catechumenal Way?

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniquilvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5th century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

All one needs to do is come and LISTEN, and you will experience how good is the Lord.
