



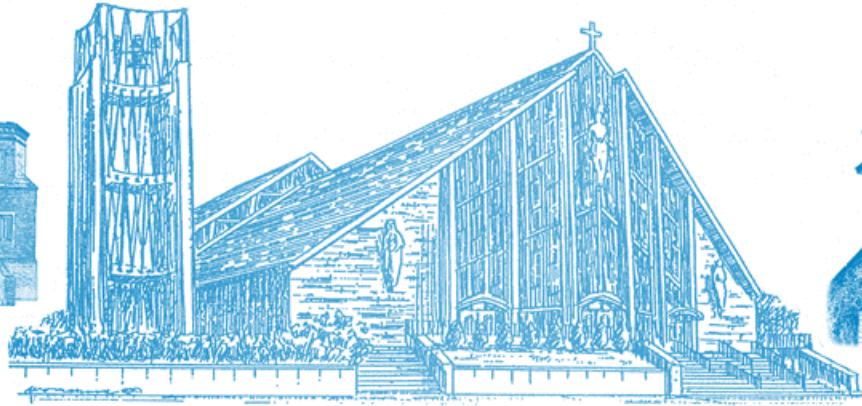

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

FROM THE
PASTOR'S DESK

As we listen to today's Gospel, it is one to which every believer needs to pay close attention, especially those of us who are pillars of our parishes. The Pharisee and the tax collector in the story are both active believers who participated in temple worship and prayed their daily prayers. The Pharisees were the serious minded believers who had committed themselves to a life of regular prayer and observance of God's Law. They felt justified in thinking well of themselves, they tended to love only the good and respectable people like themselves and looked down with contempt on sinners like tax collectors, who generally were regarded as people of low moral standards. Because tax collectors worked for the pagan Romans, mixed with them and constantly handled their unclean money, they were said to be in a state of ritual uncleanness. The tax collector stays on the edge of the temple court and does not venture into a prominent spot. In contrast to the proud Pharisee, the tax collector doesn't even lift his hands or eyes toward heaven. Instead he pounds his chest, an action separating him from the divine. Unexpectedly, it is not the devout Pharisee who is commended but, rather, the penitent tax collector. The Heavenly Father accepts his sacrifice of a broken and contrite heart.

Careful observance of religious dogma can breed pride. Believing in God is not enough. Rather, what really matters is what people believe *about* God and how their faith in God affects their view of themselves and of others. The Pharisees believed that God was quick to judge and condemn anyone who fell outside the norms of what they considered acceptable behavior, so they were similarly quick to condemn. But Jesus teaches that those who arrogantly trust in themselves and despise others reject God, no matter how many their religious activities or how worthy they may outwardly appear to be. Their worship tends to become self-centered and, as they reject others, they make God in their own image.

Let us learn a lesson from the tax collector for the secret of worshipping in a manner that is acceptable to God. We are called to acknowledge our sinfulness and entrust ourselves to the generous mercy of God, which is bigger than any sins which we may have committed. Jesus teaches us to never look down on our fellow sinners but to help them in their search for God. Our church communities are to be open and welcoming to all, especially to those who feel the margins of society. God always opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble of heart.

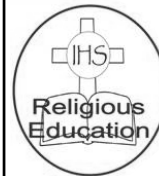
MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA
