MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we look at today's Scriptures, we see that Jesus has compassion. In today's Gospel, He comes across as overflowing with concern and care for others. But, crucially, not just for the so-called *deserving* and not for those who proclaimed Him and followed Him. Jesus had compassion on those whom others despised. Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Even today, those who collect taxes can find that they meet with hostility. At the time of the Roman occupation, Zacchaeus' job meant that he was an outsider. Tax collectors were perceived as part of the system of oppression. They paid the Romans for the chance to collect tax, and were known for extorting larger amounts than were actually required by the Romans in order to make a profit.

We see that Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house and all those around Him are surprised as well as horrified. They all grumble. But Jesus has seen what others fail to see and that is that Zacchaeus is ready to make a change in his life. He had climbed a tree to see Jesus, which must have suggested to Jesus that Zacchaeus was actually looking for something. Zacchaeus' behavior had made him an outcast in his own community. But as soon as Jesus greets him, He goes to his house and Zacchaeus is ready to make restitution. He will not just pay back the money he has extorted but, rather, is ready to pay back four times more.

In St. Luke's Gospel, this episode comes not too long after the story of the rich young man who cannot give up his wealth. He has kept God's Law but cannot leave behind the security of wealth in order to experience fully the love of God. It is too difficult for him to answer Jesus' call. In contrast, Zacchaeus is ready. He knows that what Jesus is offering is worth so much more than the money he has. Although he has money, it has not brought him the happiness or fulfillment which he longed for. He cannot depend on it to bring him peace. Rather, he chooses to depend on God instead of money.

As we reflect on the readings, we might ask ourselves what it is that we might need to change when Jesus comes to our house as he did to Zacchaeus; what would He see? Jesus has compassion for us, He loves us and He cares about us. But responding to this love with truth and honesty will often mean that we have to change. Zacchaeus realized that he could trust and depend on Jesus. He could not carry on as he was because he was damaging and hurting other people. So, rather than condemning Zacchaeus, Jesus welcomes him; this outpouring of love lights a spark in Zacchaeus. He was ready to change in response to Jesus' love.

As we continue our own journey, we might ask ourselves if we need to change; are we are full of compassion and love or do we have the tendency to condemn and judge others? Are we welcoming and open? Would we go to Zacchaeus' house or would we place ourselves in the middle of the crowd, muttering about Jesus mixing in with the wrong sort of people? If we are truly called to be brothers and sisters of the Lord, we are capable of compassion.

We might look at the times our hearts go out to our brothers and sisters in many parts of the world who suffer in natural disasters of earthquakes, typhoons, hurricanes, flooding, and even during war or acts of terrorism. But we shouldn't have to wait for disasters to happen, we could try to change our behavior a little at a time, by taking gentle steps, or we might have a massive change of heart like Zacchaeus. But change is necessary. We each know ourselves and what our temptations are. Let us give it a try over the next few weeks to be ready to respond to God's call of love by making a change in our life and doing something positive in response to Jesus' call.

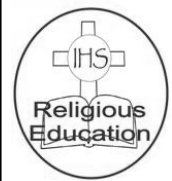
