



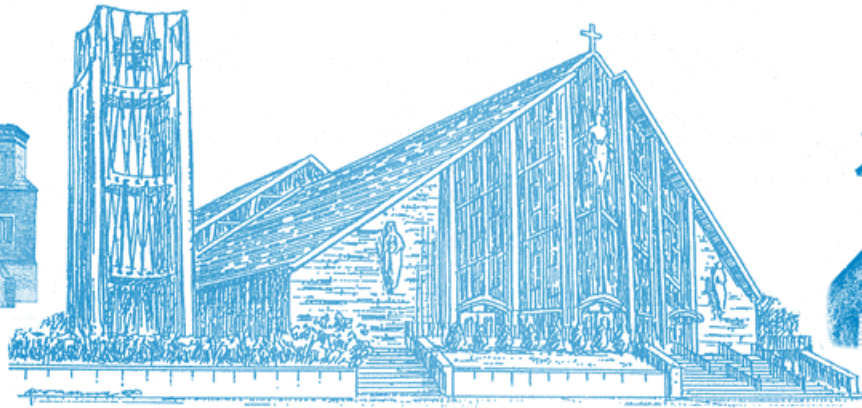

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

**PASTOR'S
LETTER**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we approach the end of the Church year, we are invited by Mother Church to think about the *end* of things. Our world, in which we spend so much time planning and securing our worldly future, is only temporary. Our lives in this world will not last forever but, while on earth, we have a duty to be faithful witnesses to the message of peace and the love given by Jesus. Our Lord cautions us that this will not make us popular. Jesus warns that His followers will be manhandled, persecuted, summoned before synagogues and imprisoned because of their faith. Some will be betrayed by family, relatives or friends. Earthquakes, plagues and famines make us selfish and move us to focus predominately on our own security but the mission of following Jesus should not be forgotten, whatever the personal cost.

Jesus asks His followers to remain committed to Him in an often hostile environment. He counsels them not to be frightened but, rather, to be faithful. By recalling His words and His promise of support, the disciples of Jesus will be equipped to face whatever difficulties arise as a consequence of Christian commitment. Moreover, each follower of Jesus can expect to face a backlash from society if they demonstrate authentic discipleship.

The Gospel challenges us to get involved in the world, working for the common good, justice and peace. Jesus urges His followers not to be passive, complacent or apathetic but rather to be willing to take a stand to promote God's kingdom, regardless of cost. There are campaigns and Christian justice organizations to get involved with that will support vulnerable people and serve the common good. We are called to remain steadfast in our faith in God's reign. In our lifetime we are seeing terrible famines, wars, as well as environmental crises, which are threatening life as we have known it and it is frightening for us. It is important for us, as Christians, to challenge structures of injustice and violence and to be a people of love and hope. Jesus promises that good will triumph over evil, love over hate, justice and peace over injustice and war, life over death.

However, for many of us, the problem is not anxiety about the end of our world but living as if there were an eternity of tomorrows. We work hard to try to guarantee ironclad security for our families. We seem to believe that all we have to do is gain enough money to guarantee a future under our control. The words of Jesus in today's Gospel are ignored. Yet the readings remind us of how short and precious life is, calling us to reflect upon our lives, urging us to look ahead to see where we are headed and ask ourselves: "What do we need to do to get ready for the coming of Jesus?"

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA

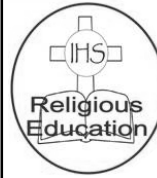

The Giving Tree will be put up by November 25th. Celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by remembering those less fortunate this year. Gifts are requested for local groups, including Nutley Special Young Adults, area AMVETS, the retired sisters at Villa

Walsh, and area children in need. To make the project a success, remember the following ground rules:

- * Each year, some tags are taken but the gifts are not returned in time. Please help us so that no one has to be disappointed at Christmas by being left out. If you take a tag, return the gift by the deadline of Wednesday, December 14th.
- * Gifts are often distributed at organizations' parties. We are asking for gifts to be returned by December 14th in order to arrange for them to be picked up and distributed before Christmas. If you wait too long to return your gift, it probably won't get to the person wishing for it. (If you're dropping a gift off on Christmas Eve, it's too late for this year.)
- * Some folks like to leave "extra" gifts under the tree, without a particular gift tag. We welcome these gifts, but help us by identifying what's inside the box. Tell us if it's a toy or clothing, for a boy or girl, man or woman, size or age, and item. We hate to unwrap a pretty box just to confirm who should get the gift inside.
- * No need to put bows or ribbons on the gifts. Just attach the gift tag from the tree (or a description on your own tags) so we know where to return the gift.
- * **If you are answering a request for a gift card or stamps or some other small item, box or bag the gift as envelopes can be too easily mislaid.**
- * Spend only what your means allow, but no more than \$25 should be spent on any gift.

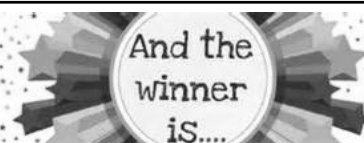

GOD'S HEALING JUSTICE

An old expression holds that the sun-warmed stone heals. Perhaps. But Malachi explains that only dark, sunless days are in store for those who do not find a place for God in their lives. Conversely, he tells us that the warmth and light of God's healing justice await those who fear the Lord. That's a pretty comforting notion—especially now in the already short and growing even shorter days of November. It's the sun-warmed stone, and then some.

Paul speaks to us of justice as well, but points out that it is not a passive thing. To be treated justly, we need to do our fair share. If we are diligent and persevere we will be rewarded with and by the fruits of our labor. Lastly, Luke, too, tells us to persevere—in faith, this time—and our lives will be secure in God regardless of how we are treated by our enemies.
