**SOCIAL SERVICE HOTLINE:** The Catholic Community Services is an office that serves all people in need. Please call 1-800-CCS-7413.

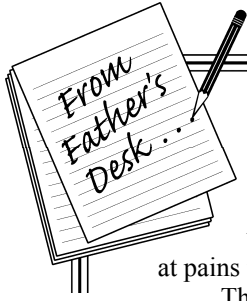

### Solemnity of Christ the King - C-2016

My brothers and sisters in the Lord;

Today we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In none of the four Gospels does Jesus claim to be a king. The Jerusalem Bible translation has Jesus' reply to Pontius Pilate's question, *so you are a king then*, with the words, "Yes, I am a king." A better translation would be, "You say I am a king." In each Gospel, Jesus does not affirm that He is a king, but He does not deny it either. In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus focuses rather on His purpose: "I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are the side of truth listen to my voice." Jesus, although He has agreed that He is a king, is at pains to show that His kingship is not to be understood in terms of this world.

The Sunday Gospels for this year have predominately been from St. Luke and today's feast is no exception. Like the other three evangelists, Luke avoids any suggestion that Jesus explicitly claimed to be a king, nor does He explicitly reject the title, however, in each of the Gospels the evangelist gives some insight from the story of Jesus' passion and death to illustrate what kind of king Jesus may be. It isn't a surprise that in St. Luke's account, which we just heard, there is a particular emphasis that we can identify and which appears throughout the entire Gospel. There is a constant emphasis on the mercy of God throughout St. Luke, from the reference of Mary's Magnificat, before the birth of Jesus, where Mary proclaims that God, "has come to help Israel His servant, mindful of His mercy," through Jesus' proclamation in the Nazareth synagogue that He has come to bring "good news to the poor," on to the parables of the good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son, and continuing to His prayer while He is being nailed to the cross, with the words: "Forgive them for they do not know what they are doing." Finally, this mercy is extended to the criminal crucified next to Him; the one who has just acknowledged that he and his co-accused were paying for what they had done, whereas Jesus, "had done nothing wrong." This one asks, *Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom*. And Jesus replies, "I promise that you will be with me in paradise, today." In word and action throughout His life, and now in the final stages of His suffering and as His death approaches, Jesus shows that His kingship lies in His expression of the mercy of God, a mercy He makes a reality and not just an aspiration.

In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus defines His kingship in terms of witnessing to the truth, saying that all who are on the side of truth listen to His voice. In the Gospel of St. Luke, Jesus' words and actions require or demand a response from those who claim to be His followers. He requires of His followers that they be merciful as His Father is merciful. If we need evidence as to what the mercy of God is like, all we need to do is look at the action of Jesus, the king who embodies the mercy of God. As He told the lawyer who identified the Samaritan in the parables as a true neighbor, we can imagine Jesus saying to us that if we would know what the mercy of God is like, we need only consider Jesus' words and actions and then, "do the same yourself."

This week we celebrate Thanksgiving and I invite all of you to join us for Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 9:00. We have so much to be grateful for: our family, our friends, as well as the many challenges that life brings us which helps us grow. As we celebrate this day, let us truly give thanks to God for the gift and legacy of love which the original settlers left us to continue for many generations to come. Let us remember in our prayers the less fortunate, those who have no one to care for them, that through our prayers they may be strengthened and know the presence of God in their lives.

On behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco, our entire staff and I, we wish you and your loved ones God's special blessings.

- \* Each year, some tags are taken but the gifts are not returned in time. Please help us so that no one has to be disappointed at Christmas by being left out. If you take a tag, return the gift by the deadline of Wednesday, December 14th.
- \* Gifts are often distributed at organizations' parties. We are asking for gifts to be returned by December 14th in order to arrange for them to be picked up and distributed before Christmas. If you wait too long to return your gift, it probably won't get to the person wishing for it. (If you're dropping a gift off on Christmas Eve, it's too late for this year.)
- \* Some folks like to leave "extra" gifts under the tree, without a particular gift tag. We welcome these gifts, but help us by identifying what's inside the box. Tell us if it's a toy or clothing, for a boy or girl, man or woman, size or age, and item. We hate to unwrap a pretty box just to confirm who should get the gift inside.
- \* No need to put bows or ribbons on the gifts. Just attach the gift tag from the tree (or a description on your own tags) so we know where to return the gift.
- \* **If you are answering a request for a gift card or stamps or some other small item, box or bag the gift as envelopes can be too easily mislaid.**
- \* Spend only what your means allow, but no more than \$25 should be spent on any gift.
