



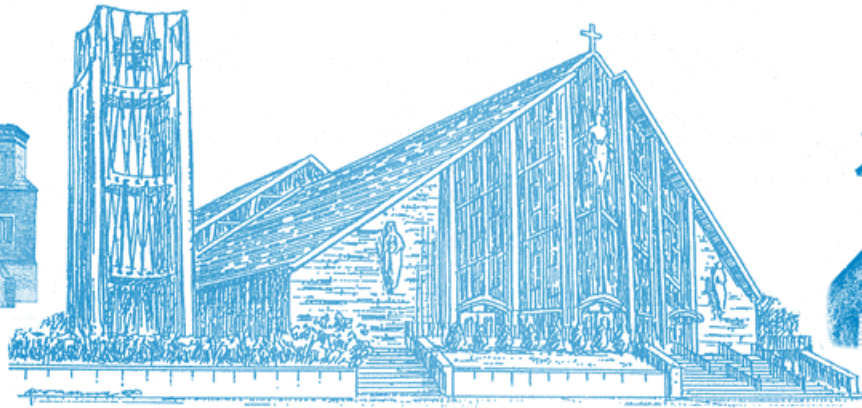

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

**EMERGENCY CALLS:** In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

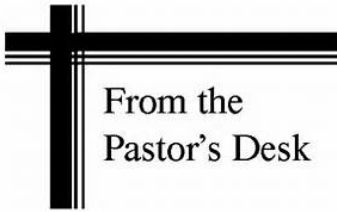

**From the  
Pastor's Desk**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today's readings confront us with the question of what death is and what follows. That question is important because it helps us shape how we live in the present. In today's First Reading, those seven brothers were able to endure terrible hardship because of their strong faith in God and also because of God's ability to raise them up after death. Their belief in the resurrection enabled them to remain true to their identity,

to their value and, most especially, to their God.

In the Gospel, the Sadducees, who believed that there was no after-life, dragged up a seldom used law about marrying your dead brother's wife in order to ridicule Jesus' belief in the resurrection of the dead. That law was designed to ensure that a man's name lived on after his death. Jesus says that for those who belong to God, there is no need for such devices to try to cheat death. Those who have died and judged worthy are living with God, where there is no need to think of marrying and having children to try to preserve your name to carry on the human race. The answer to that is, quite simply, because there is no more death. Those who are worthy are living a new kind of life as sons and daughters of God. Death has no more power over them. Jesus is crystal clear; He tells us that this life is not the end. God wants us to live in His presence forever.

This month of November is dedicated to our beloved dead and critics may regard this month of prayer as a Catholic presumption that, in the face of death, we seem unable to let go of our loved ones. But in reality, no matter how deep our grief might be, this month of prayer is actually an affirmation of our faith in the power of God's love, which is stronger than death. It is an expression of our hope in the resurrection; that just as God our Father raised Jesus from the dead, so He will raise all those who belong to Him.

We might ask ourselves what difference faith in the resurrection actually makes in our lives. Sometimes religious people are accused of being so heavenly-minded that they are of no earthly use. They even disengage from the problems of this world and just focus on church matters. But that's not where faith in the resurrection should lead us. Our belief in the resurrection shows us that, to God, life is absolutely important. God created us for life, not death. God is God of the living. Jesus tells us this and what we do in this life determines our future with God.



My brothers and sisters, in a few days we will be making an important decision as we cast our vote on Election Day. We have the power to proclaim our faith in God. To believe in God, in the God of Abraham, is to believe in the God who wants us all to live. And if we truly believe in our faith, it means that we will strive to defend life from conception to natural death and oppose everything that is contrary and diminishes life or robs people of life in any way; whether such

attacks come from physical violence or oppression, illness or lack of education, or economic justice and inequality. We make the decision in proclaiming our faith by the decisions we make. Faith in the resurrection led the seven brothers to resist an evil king. It led Jesus to the cross. And for us as Christians, it leads us to cherish life here and now and to defend life for all, especially those whose quality of life is most threatened - - innocent babies as well as the defenseless elderly.

Please pray for the Holy Spirit to be present in our conscience to guide us with making the choices as we cast our vote on Tuesday. May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph intercede for us at the throne of God.

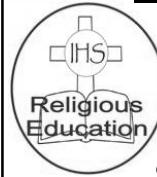

Walsh, and area children in need. To make the project a success, remember the following ground rules:

- \* Each year, some tags are taken but the gifts are not returned in time. Please help us so that no one has to be disappointed at Christmas by being left out. If you take a tag, return the gift by the deadline of Wednesday, December 14th.
- \* Gifts are often distributed at organizations' parties. We are asking for gifts to be returned by December 14th in order to arrange for them to be picked up and distributed before Christmas. If you wait too long to return your gift, it probably won't get to the person wishing for it. (If you're dropping a gift off on Christmas Eve, it's too late for this year.)
- \* Some folks like to leave "extra" gifts under the tree, without a particular gift tag. We welcome these gifts, but help us by identifying what's inside the box. Tell us if it's a toy or clothing, for a boy or girl, man or woman, size or age, and item. We hate to unwrap a pretty box just to confirm who should get the gift inside.
- \* No need to put bows or ribbons on the gifts. Just attach the gift tag from the tree (or a description on your own tags) so we know where to return the gift.
- \* **If you are answering a request for a gift card or stamps or some other small item, box or bag the gift as envelopes can be too easily mislaid.**
- \* Spend only what your means allow, but no more than \$25 should be spent on any gift.
