







BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Merry Christmas! Seems hard to believe it is here and, in the darkness of this night, we come to celebrate the coming of the Light. Like the shepherds in Bethlehem, we hear again the song of the angels telling us of a child born for us, a Savior. We hear those reassuring words that resound through the Gospel story, "Do not be afraid." There is good news to tell you, news that will always survive the evil that human beings can do. There is a joy meant for us, a reason to believe, and a cause of happiness that we can know and share in.

St. Paul explains it in his letter to Titus; the coming of the child into the world is the revealing of God's loving kindness to us all. It means that we no longer have to fend for ourselves, as if salvation depended on us alone. From now on we are called to one ambition, that of doing good everywhere and in every circumstance of life. We are being called again today to follow the Lord who was born for us.

The child born this night calls us to be purified of all wickedness and selfish ways. He calls us again to belong to Him, to cling to Him, to follow Him every day of our lives and to do so with one single ambition, that is to do good in this world to everyone, in every situation.

Here in the Church, as in all our churches throughout the world, we have prepared a Christmas Crib, a tradition that originated with St. Francis of Assisi in the thirteenth century. Not everyone can visit the birth place of Jesus in Bethlehem and so we recreate its presence among us by means of a simple crib. Some cribs can be very dramatic affairs, with flowing water and many other features. People love to make cribs. They are a powerful focus for our attention and prayer.

Cribs have special attraction for children and indeed for the child inside of each one of us. The mysteries of the Lord are hidden from the learned and the clever and are revealed to mere children. Gathered around the figures in the straw we see the beauty of the human person in the form and features of a newborn baby. This is the child who will be the Prince of Peace.

The child that we first glimpse lying in the straw, we will one day see nailed to the cross and then laid in a tomb. After His rising we will recognize Him in the breaking of the bread, as we do now in this Christmas Mass. This same Lord tells us that we can also recognize Him in one another as we hear in the words; "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you do to me." That is what St. Paul is telling us about the ambition to do good.

Together with Fr. Mauro and Fr. Francesco, we wish you a blessed Christmas Season.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An old joke asks, "What time is Midnight Mass?" The answer is not really obvious, since Christmas is unique in having several distinct celebrations. The readings and prayers vary greatly from hour to hour. The Vigil Mass hinges on the family heritage of Jesus and his origins. The concept of "midnight" predates clock time, and really has to do with a celebration in the hours of darkness. Years ago, it was not possible to receive Communion without fasting for a full day, so the late hour of this Mass made it possible for the people to receive. The first Mass after sunrise, the Mass at Dawn, was once known as "The Shepherds' Mass," and later Masses set aside stories of Jesus' birth to focus on the key to the day's celebration: John the Evangelist's majestic theology of Christ's identity as the Word made flesh, dwelling among us. One feast, four separate Masses. Only monasteries manage the whole round. Parishioners typically take just one entry point into the mystery. Yet there is much to savor and celebrate in the coming of Christ into the world. Christmas is not a day, but a season. You still have two weeks to send those Christmas cards before you're officially late!

Start the New Year with Discovering Christ
