My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Once the Gospel of Matthew gets fully under way, there is much mention of the term *the Good News*. Jesus proclaims that the kingdom of God is at hand and people should repent and believe the Good News but we are not really told what this *Good News* actually is. Jesus then challenges Simon, Andrew, James and John, to stop what they are doing and follow Him. They are not told where they are going. There is a curiosity and building sense of excitement but, again, no detail about this *Good News*. The Gospel then gives a summary of Jesus' activity: He preaches in synagogues and He heals sick people. This does begin to sound like the "Good News" for those involved but we suspect there must be more to come and this is the point we reach in today's Gospel.



It is here that we begin to understand the scope of the Good News. It is fully outlined in the Sermon on the Mount which Jesus now preaches. His first five public sermons spread throughout the Gospel of Matthew. Today's passages of the famous introduction, which we know as the Beatitudes, constitute one of the most familiar of all Gospel passages. It is used in the liturgy of the Church more than any other Gospel text, covering a surprising range from Ordinary Sundays and weekdays to major seasons, from funerals to weddings, and on a variety of commemorations, sacramental ceremonies, as well as saints' days. It is the first passage in the Gospel of Matthew to give a clear indication of what Jesus means by *the Good News*.

My brothers and sisters, the Good News is that the kingdom of God is at hand. Jesus turned word into action when He cured sick people, cleansed lepers and forgave sinners. It is here that He made the words of the Beatitudes a reality for those whose lives were broken. It is the Good News that the values of God are here for all of us to share. In Jesus' final sermon in Matthew, in the Last Judgment parable, He tells His followers that however they behave towards the least of His brothers and sisters is the way they behave to Christ Himself. Reflecting upon this, we might say that we *hear* the Good News but are we honestly living it out and sharing it with others?

This week we begin the celebration of Catholic Schools Week. We are truly blessed to have a thriving school at Good Shepherd Academy. I am grateful for our dedicated teachers and staff, under the direction of Sr. Jane Feltz, M.P.F. God has truly blessed us with a growing number of students from Pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Please visit our school. We are also blessed with a successful Religious Education Program under the direction of Sr. Ella Mae McDonald, M.P.F., and her volunteer catechists, who touch the lives of our students with the gift of their faith and spirituality. Please pray for the continued success and growth of our and Religious Ed Program. I am also grateful for Sr. Romilda and the Franciscan Sisters of Saint Elizabeth at the Holy Family Day Nursery. How lovingly they nurture the pre-school 3 & 4 year-old children in the faith. May God bless all who give of their Time, Talent and Treasure of Heart for nurturing of our children, most especially, in their faith and love of God.

This week we welcome Fr. William Cook who will be part of our parish, in residence. Fr. Cook has retired after 14 years as pastor and faithful service to the Parish Community of Holy Name of Jesus in East Orange. Fr. Cook will be helping with Masses. Please pray for him, as well as the parishioners of Holy Name, as we know change is always challenging. I know our Parish Family will make him feel comfortable as he adjusts to his retirement.
