



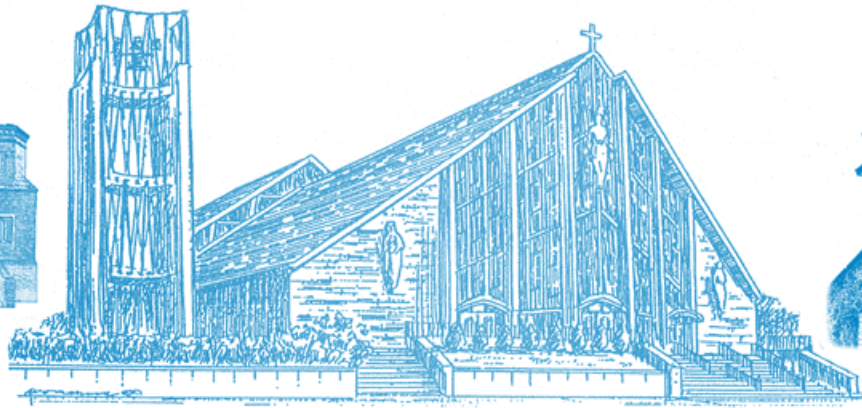

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

There are so many behind-the-scenes volunteers, you know who are and, most importantly, the Lord knows who you are. All I can say is thank you!

On behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco, and our Seminarists, we are especially grateful for the many homemade goodies, gift baskets, as well as monetary gifts, which we received during the Christmas Season. This past Friday, with the installation of our new Archbishop Cardinal Joseph Tobin, we begin a new journey of challenges as Cardinal Tobin begins his ministry and leadership within the Archdiocese of Newark. Let us keep him in our prayers as he faces the many challenges here. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and lead him through the joys and struggles of his ministry. Let us also keep in prayer, Archbishop Myers as he begins his time of retirement, that the Lord will bless him with good health and rest. I am grateful for his trust and support in giving me the opportunity to serve the parish family of Holy Family and his support for our parish in many ways.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. We learn the account of another journey, one undertaken over two thousand years ago, as recounted in today's Gospel. This is the story of the Three Wise Men who followed the guidance of a star to Bethlehem. Although it is recorded only in the Gospel of St. Matthew, the event has been celebrated in the Eastern Church since the third century in honor of Jesus' baptism. It became celebrated in the Western Church during the fourth century when it became associated with the first manifestation or "epiphany" of Christ to the Gentiles (non-Jewish people), represented by these wise men or *magi*, which can also mean *astrologers*. That they had come from the East indicates Mesopotamia, the center of astrology, and a long journey could have taken many months. Over the centuries, Matthew's accounts were embellished in the Christian tradition; they were named kings, their number became *three* perhaps because of their three gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and they were given the names Casper, Melchior and Balthasar. They were venerated as saints from the middle ages and their relics are enshrined in the Cologne Cathedral. In all the images of the *Adoration of the Magi*, the central message is that Jesus is the Savior of all people and none are excluded from His love. The Wise Men had followed the star, the light given to them by God to serve others and finding their way to God. As we offer our prayers, may that same light be a light to our journey. May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph bless you abundantly in a special way as we begin this New Year of 2017.

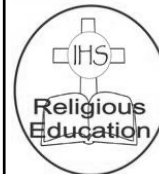
MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA

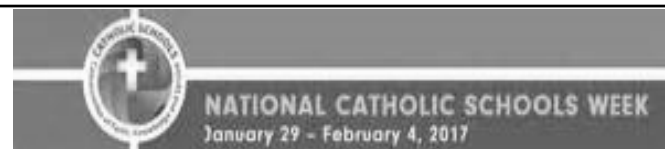
