BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we listen to today's Gospel, the character of Jesus emerges as gentle and strong, peaceful, forthright, and courageous. Never does Jesus act in a violent manner nor does He say things to provoke people to riot or revolt. Yet His every word is challenging and demanding. We must remember that Jesus' call asks for nothing less than everything by way of a commitment to Him.

In His words that we hear today, part of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus will not settle for outward observance or superficial fulfilment of God's commandments. The Scribes and Pharisees are good at that, He says. It's not enough to avoid adultery; you must live a sexually honest life. It is not enough to avoid big sins because all sins are damaging. There is no need to swear oaths, just use honest and straightforward speech.

These are the deep roots of true life, of good life, and nothing less will do, says the Lord. The Sermon on the Mount challenges us, every day, to a deeper fulfilment of God's word. Superficial skimming will never be acceptable. Now we begin to see how and why Jesus became such a problem for people. We live in challenging world where the number one priority should be to seek reconciliation, to be willing to talk, to be willing to learn and to be willing to get to know others.

This is the vocation of each of us, no matter where we live. We are called to contribute to it by our way of life. The great wisdom we are asked to learn calls upon us to love one another. Those who did not know this killed Jesus, the Lord of Glory. Peace of heart, mind, and attitude are tremendous gifts of grace but they exist in a troubled world. Our Lord tells us to be brave because He has overcome the world.

Last week-end we had the kick off for Sharing God's Blessings Annual Appeal. Let us recall the Corporal Works of Mercy: *Feeding the Hungry, Giving Drink to the Thirsty, Clothing the Naked, Sheltering the Homeless, Visiting the Sick, Visiting the Imprisoned and Burying the Dead*. Remember, too, that we have an obligation to others and that the gifts God has given us are not for our exclusive use, but are meant to be shared. Once again I invite you to consider joining me in *Sharing God's Blessings*. I ask you to take a moment and fill out the gift brochure. Please know that I am personally grateful for your support and all that you do.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA



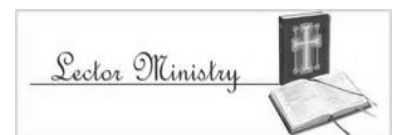

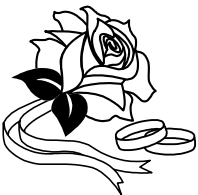
