



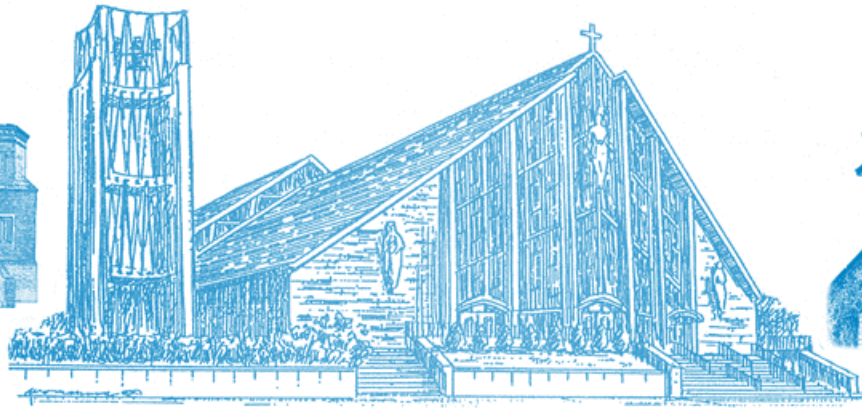

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we read through the Scriptures, we may sometimes think that the law of love belongs to the New Testament whereas the law of retribution, "...and an eye for an eye," dominates the Old Testament. Yet today, as we see in the book of Leviticus, the injunction is to not take vengeance but, rather, to love our neighbor as ourselves. The challenge addressed by Jesus takes this commandment a step further. Jesus acknowledges that even tax collectors and pagans are neighborly to those who are good to them. The difficult question is how do we react to those who are our enemies and to those who treat us badly?

In the Sermon on the Mount, which has formed our Gospel readings over the last few Sundays, Jesus is explaining what the Beatitudes mean in practice. What does it mean to be *meek*? What does it mean to be *merciful*? You wonder whether lurking in the back of His mind is the awareness of what His commitment to us, who are sinners, is going to demand of Him at the end of His life. We wonder if the passion is already in His consciousness. It is certainly there in the awareness of the Gospel writers, who are writing as though it were backwards, trying to explain how those great salvific events of death and resurrection came about. They came about because Jesus was capable of obeying His own injunction to love His enemies and to pray for His persecutors. It is in this way He shows us how to be perfect, just as His heavenly Father is perfect.

When faced with words such as *holiness* and *perfection*, our first reaction may be to distance ourselves from them. Such terms belong to the saints. They do not come into the orbit of our everyday world. It is true that we are not required to live at these heights every moment. Moral theologians used to make a distinction between behaviors that were required of us to be good rather than bad and behaviors that were counsels of perfection, those acts of self-sacrifice that probably belonged only to the few. But Jesus does not make such distinctions. He asks us to consider that if we are His true followers, we have the potential to respond at this level. All of us can follow in His footsteps.

It is not behavior that we can chart accurately in advance. The times when we are asked to give of ourselves completely are few and far between. But we prepare ourselves for such challenges by the way we live through the day-to-day moments of our lives. If we think of others rather than ourselves, if we are not overwhelmed when others fail to notice us or even treat us with respect, when we are sensitive to other's needs as well as our own, especially those who are not close to us or with whom we have little in common, through all those moments we are becoming disciples of Christ. Disciples who are learning to be perfect just as our heavenly Father is perfect. We might remember that we can learn to be like God through those little nameless acts of love that we are asked to perform every day of our lives.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In brushing up for "Catholic Jeopardy," it might help to know that there is only one feast on the calendar for a thing, rather than a person or mystery. It's for a chair: Saint Peter's chair in fact. (Celebrated Wednesday, February 22)

After the Resurrection, there can be no doubt that the disciples reserved a special place for Simon Peter in the upper room. Later, Peter became the bishop of Antioch in today's Syria, the place where we were first called "Christians." From there, he went to Rome, the center of the Empire, where it is said that Peter sat in a chair in the house of Priscilla and Aquila to instruct his flock. Jesus, in entrusting the keys of the Kingdom to Peter and his successors, entrusted His compassion and mercy to them, and charged them with pointing to the Kingdom of God. Compassion and mercy are to resonate through their teaching.

Since the ancient sign of a teacher is the chair ("disciple" literally means one who sits at the feet of a teacher), Peter's chair has long been treasured. Today there is a symbolic shrine of Peter's chair above the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This monument is the last work of Bernini, a huge bronze throne supported by four doctors of the Church: Augustine and Ambrose from the Western Church, and Chrysostom and Athanasius from the East. High above it is the alabaster window of the descent of the Holy Spirit.

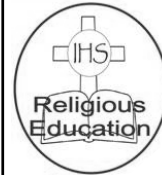
CATHOLIC SINGLE PARENT SUPPORT GROUPS

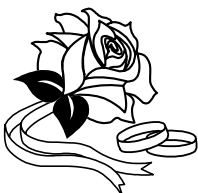
