



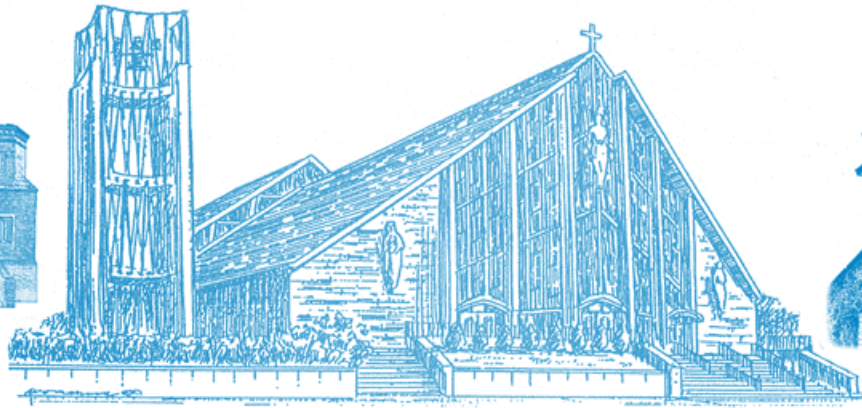

RECONCILIATION: Saturday, 1:00 PM

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

Message from the Pastor

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time - A 2017

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

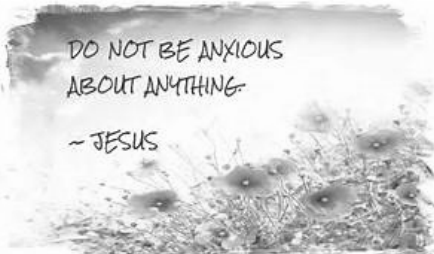
As we read through the Scriptures, we may sometimes think that the law of love belongs to the New Testament whereas the law of retribution, "an eye for an eye," dominates the Old Testament. Yet, today we read in the book of Leviticus the injunction to not take vengeance but to love our neighbor as ourselves. The challenge addressed by Jesus takes this commandment a step further. Jesus acknowledges that even tax collectors and pagans are neighborly to those who are good to them. The difficult question is how to react to those who are our enemies and to those who treat us badly.

In the Sermon on the Mount, which has formed our Gospel readings over the last few Sundays, Jesus explained what the Beatitudes mean in practice. What does it mean to be meek? What does it mean to be merciful? You wonder whether lurking in the back of His mind is the awareness of what His commitment to us, who are sinners, is going to demand of Him at the end of His life. We wonder if the Passion is already in His consciousness. It is certainly there in the awareness of the Gospel writers, who are writing as if it was backwards, trying to explain how those great salvific events of death and resurrection came about. They came about because Jesus is capable of obeying His own injunction to love His enemies and to pray for His persecutors. It is in this way He shows us how to be perfect, just as His heavenly Father is perfect.

When faced with words such as *holiness* and *perfection*, our first reaction may be to distance ourselves from them. Such terms belong to the saints. They do not come into the orbit of our everyday world. It is true that we are not required to live at these heights every moment. Moral theologians used to make a distinction between behaviors that were required of us to be good rather than bad and behaviors that were counsels of perfection, those acts of self-sacrifice that probably belonged only to the few. But Jesus does not make such distinctions. He asks us to consider that if we are His true followers, we have the potential to respond at this level. We can follow in His footsteps.

It is not behavior that we can accurately chart in advance. The times when we are asked to give of ourselves completely are few and far between. But we prepare ourselves for such challenges by the way we live through the day-to-day moments of our lives. If we think of others rather than ourselves, if we are not overwhelmed when others fail to notice us or even treat us with respect, when we are sensitive to other's needs as well as our own, especially those who are not close to us or with whom we have little in common, through all those moments we are becoming disciples of Christ. Disciples who are learning to be perfect just as our heavenly Father is perfect. We might remember that we can learn to be like God through those little nameless acts of love that we are asked to perform every day of our lives.

People have, it seems, a natural penchant for misplaced emphasis on unimportant things. They can easily get caught up with what they're having for dinner or what they will wear.

Often it is a tragedy that helps people to refocus on what is really important. What I shall wear is an irrelevant question when I am facing surgery or chemotherapy. What's for dinner is immaterial to those living through grief or unemployment.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us not to worry. He doesn't say, "Don't eat. Don't cook. Don't buy clothes." He says, "Don't worry." Jesus asks us not to relinquish our responsibilities but to let go of our anxiety. Anxiety betrays a lack of trust and Jesus reminds us that "Your heavenly Father knows" all that you need (Matthew 6:32).

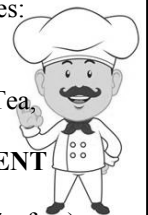

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially,” or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.**

**Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES, 2017

ASH WEDNESDAY, March 1: Ashes will be distributed **during** Masses and services, **all in the Church**. Masses at 7:00 & 8:45 A.M., 12:00 Noon, and 7:00 P.M. (bi-lingual) - Service only at 4:00 P.M.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: In the Chapel on Fridays at 2:00 P.M., (except First Friday, March 3); and in the Church at 6:45 P.M. (English); 7:45 P.M. (Italian), every Friday during Lent.

On Good Friday, April 14, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

RECONCILIATION: Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, April 15, which is Holy Saturday); every Wednesday night during Lent from 7:00-8:00 in the Chapel.

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST:

Every Friday, Exposition of the Eucharist is 9:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., concluding with Benediction.

On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.

First Friday, March 3, with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M., at which time there will be Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, and Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross.

The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, March 26, 2017.

FASTING & ALMSGIVING: Operation Rice Bowls, which are distributed in today’s bulletin and are also available in the Church vestibule, help to support Catholic Relief Services care for the poor in developing countries. Please use the calendar and eat a *simpler* meal each week (fasting) and place your sacrifice (alms), the money you save in terms of eating a simpler meal, and return your sacrifice in the envelope provided on Palm Sunday, April 9th. “Let us eat simply so that others may simply eat.”

FORMATION

- Suggested Lenten penances will be distributed on Ash Wednesday and each Sunday of Lent as a way of reminding us to make our pledge to enter into these forty days of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, truly a time of Penance and conversion of the heart.

- Bible Study on Thursday evenings, 7:30 P.M., in the St. Joseph Center. There is no Bible Study on Holy Thursday.

Please note that the Mother Cabrini Chapel will be open every day from **6:45 AM until 9:00 PM** for your own private prayer time and devotions.

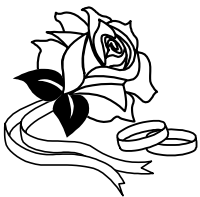
