BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

In the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, Peter, James and John have an experience of seeing Jesus as truly being amazing. They are able to recognize His divinity, as they see Him for who He really is. On that mountain, Jesus shines as the true source of light and the Father affirms His delight in Him and the trust He has placed in Him. Naturally, recognizing that they are in the presence of God, the disciples are frightened and put their faces to the ground, but their desire is to remain in that presence. We hear the words of Peter who says: "Lord, it is wonderful to be here." Through the Transfiguration, the disciples see the true face of Jesus and there is not a thing that they would want to change because, suddenly, they know that Jesus is truly awesome just the way He is, that is to say, fully human and divine.

The Father's showing of Jesus for who He really is in the Transfiguration is an encouragement for the disciples for what is lying ahead of them. The revelation of Jesus as the fulfillment of the law and prophets, as seen through the appearance of Moses and Elijah, and the confirmation of Him as the beloved Son, puts fresh heart into His followers and spurs Jesus on at a time when the cross will soon appear. In time, reflecting on Jesus' Resurrection and Ascension, the disciples will be able to look back and, with the enlightenment of the Spirit, recall the truth of this incredible encounter. What happened on the mountain will be an inspiration for countless generations to come.

As we reflect on today's Gospel at this point of the Lenten journey, it is also an encouragement for us to see who we really are as God's blessed children. The manifestation of God's glory in Jesus is a gift to help us see something that very often we find difficult to acknowledge; that in Jesus we, too, are beloved sons and daughters of God. After all, if we are honest with ourselves, few people see the real "us". We wear different masks for different places, be it at work, home or church. Many of us are terrified of criticism and rejection. We want to be in control; to be loved; to have approval as well as affirmation. However, when we venture deep inside ourselves, we catch a glimpse of the people we truly are. We start to see ourselves as God sees us. Once we remove the mask and reveal the "real us", change happens. All those negative things come to clarity and our dreams become much clearer. Once we take off our masks others are bound to do the same so that our genuineness builds a bridge from one person to another.

My brothers and sisters, we must remember that that we are God's children, beautifully made as God's unique creations; wonderfully designed to live a joyful life growing ever more into fullness. Saint Paul writes in his letter to Timothy about the appearance of our savior Jesus Christ, in whom we have been given grace from the beginning of time. We have been chosen and just as Abraham was singled out for great blessings, so are we. This Lenten Season is a perfect time to look beyond the surface and get in touch with our uniquely fashioned selves.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year, the celebration of the Feast of St. Patrick -- March 17, 2017 -- falls on the Friday of the Second Week of Lent.

After due consideration of a number of requests, I dispense the people of the Archdiocese of Newark from the obligation to abstain from meat on Friday, March 17, 2017. I remind Catholics who avail themselves of this dispensation that the Church highly encourages you to substitute some other act of penance, such as special prayer, acts of piety or works of charity on March 17th.

Please share this information with all in your parish and school communities. I also encourage you to take advantage of the opportunity to remind your communities of the Lenten Regulations.

2017 Lenten Regulations: *The Code of Canon Law (can.1253) allows a pastor to grant, in individual cases and for a just cause, a commutation of the obligations associated with the Lenten Days of penance into pious works. The Code would also allow a pastor in those circumstances to dispense an individual from specific obligations. With the celebration of St. Patrick's Day falling on a Friday this year dispensation is granted, however, may I suggest that another day be taken in order to fulfill the penance for that day. 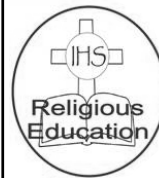

- *Fast from hurting words and say kind words*
- *Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude*
- *Fast from anger and be filled with patience*
- *Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope*
- *Fast from worries and trust in God*
- *Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity*
- *Fast from pressures and be prayerful*
- *Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy*
- *Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others*
- *Fast from grudges and be reconciled*
- *Fast from words and be silent so you can listen*

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.**

**Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES, 2017

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: In Church at 6:45 P.M. (English); 7:45 P.M. (Italian), every Friday during Lent. On Good Friday, April 14, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

RECONCILIATION: Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, April 15, which is Holy Saturday); every Wednesday night during Lent from 7:00-8:00 in the Chapel.

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST: Every Friday, Exposition of the Eucharist is 9:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., concluding with Benediction. On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary. First Friday, April 7, with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M., at which time there will be Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, and Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross.

The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. bilingual English/Italian Mass on Sunday, March 26, 2017. Msgr. Paul Bochicchio will concelebrate the Mass. Refreshments will be served immediately following in the St. Joseph Center.

FASTING & ALMSGIVING: Operation Rice Bowls, which were previously distributed, are still available in the Church vestibule. They help to support Catholic Relief Services care for the poor in developing countries. Please use the calendar and eat a *simpler* meal each week (fasting) and place your sacrifice (alms), the money you save in terms of eating a simpler meal, and return your sacrifice in the envelope provided on Palm Sunday, April 9th. "Let us eat simply so that others may simply eat."

FORMATION

- Suggested Lenten penances will be distributed on Ash Wednesday and each Sunday of Lent as a way of reminding us to make our pledge to enter into these forty days of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, truly a time of Penance and conversion of the heart.
- Bible Study on Thursday evenings, 7:30 P.M., in the St. Joseph Center. There is no Bible Study on Holy Thursday.

Please note that the Mother Cabrini Chapel will be open every day from **6:45 AM until 9:00 PM** for your own private prayer time and devotions.

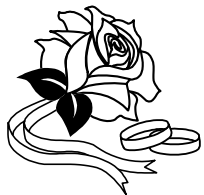
