MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

St. Teresa of Calcutta, or Mother Teresa as all lovingly know her, felt that our greatest suffering is not our need or weakness itself but rather the feeling of uselessness, or being worthless, unappreciated and unloved. She felt there was a voice in our culture that insists that only the beautiful and successful are lovable. Mother Teresa loved the story of Jesus and the Samaritan woman; she felt that the Samaritan woman symbolized our human poverty and yet the possibility of salvation. As a Samaritan, we know that the woman was an outcast of society as well as a public

sinner, losing her dignity as a person and, yet, she has this life-changing encounter with Jesus. In a letter to her Missionaries of Charity at Easter 1993, referring to the story of the Samaritan woman, Mother Teresa wrote:

“Jesus wants me to tell you again how much love He has for each one of you, beyond all you can imagine. Not only that He loves you, even more, He longs for you. He misses you when you do not come close. He thirsts for you. He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy. Why does Jesus say, “I thirst?” What does it mean? It is something hard to explain in words. *I thirst* is something deeper than Jesus just saying “I love you.” Until you know deep inside that Jesus thirsts for you, you can't begin to know who He wants to be for you. Or who He wants you to be for Him.”

The Samaritan woman in today's Gospel, whose name we do not know, has the longest conversation recorded between Jesus and any person. It was noon on a hot day and Jesus was tired from travelling when He chose *Jacob's well*, a rest stop just outside the town of Sychar, to wait for His disciples to bring food. The woman who joined Him at the well was an outcast, looked down upon by her own people. She came alone to draw water from the community well when, during biblical times, water and chatting at the well was the social high point of any woman's day. But this woman was ostracized and marked as immoral, an unmarried woman living openly with the sixth in a series on men.

When this unnamed woman appeared with clay jar in hand, Jesus made a simple request of her, “Give me a drink.” But Jews weren't supposed to speak to Samaritans. Men were not allowed to speak to women without their husbands present. And rabbis had no business speaking to shady women such as this one. We see that Jesus is willing to ignore the rules but the woman reminded Him, “You are a Jew and you ask me, a Samaritan, for a drink?” She focused on the laws of respectable society but Jesus focuses on grace. Jesus also lets her know that He is aware of the much suffering in her life. And then, to this woman, Jesus reveals that He is the Messiah and is offering her the living water. She forgot about her own need to draw water and she runs off to tell others about Jesus. This Samaritan woman became a powerful evangelist.

When you think about it, all of us are this Samaritan woman because all of us are wounded in some way, whether it be in love or have a history of broken relationships; when we feel left out, mistreated, passed over, not chosen, rejected, unsafe, whenever we feel judged, condemned, or bad about ourselves, then Jesus comes to us and gives us solace.

Jesus' ministering to the outcasts of the Jewish society revealed that all people are valuable to God and that Jesus desires us to demonstrate love to everyone, including our enemies. Jesus' mission to those who are lost is a radical commission; it means leaving our comfort zone and making ourselves vulnerable in order to love people who are different from us. And great sights can come from those at the margins of society who receive God's message with humility, trust and joy. The story of the woman at the well teaches us that God loves every one of us, especially those of us who feel ourselves undervalued and even worthless. God values us all enough to actively seek us and engage with us. The Samaritan woman understood what this meant, that is to be wanted, to be cared for when no one, even herself, could see anything of value in her.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.**

***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: In Church at 6:45 P.M. (English); 7:45 P.M. (Italian), every Friday during Lent.

On Good Friday, April 14, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

RECONCILIATION: Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, April 15, which is Holy Saturday)

Every Wednesday night during Lent from 7:00-8:00 in the Chapel.

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST: Every Friday, Exposition of the Eucharist is 9:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., concluding with Benediction.


On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary. First Friday, April 7, with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M., at which time there will be Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, and Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS: During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross. The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, March 26, 2017.


FASTING & ALMSGIVING: Operation Rice Bowls are available in the Church vestibule to help support Catholic Relief Services care for the poor in developing countries. Please use the calendar and eat a *simpler* meal each week (fasting) and place your sacrifice (alms), the money you save in terms of eating a simpler meal, and return your sacrifice in the envelope provided on Palm Sunday, April 9th. "Let us eat simply so that others may simply eat."
