



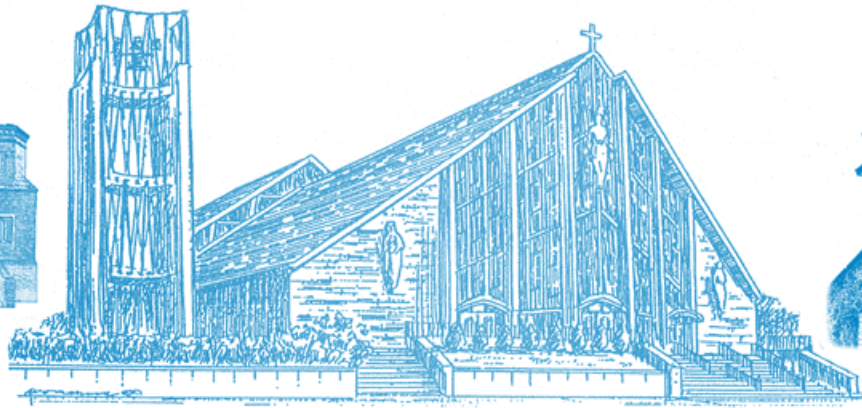

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!



The story of the *Fall Into Sin* of Adam and Eve, which we heard in today's first reading, endlessly fascinates us because it is the story of every man and every woman and of each one of us as well. At some point in our life we all face the possibility of falling into sin, when we are tempted to *be like gods*. It may occur through the betrayal of a person we love, through a lie that has serious effects, or a business practice that destroys other people for the advancement of our own career for the sake of profit. Then we are like our first parents, Adam and Eve, who chose to go against God and be

satisfied by eating fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. The story tells us that the serpent tempts Eve, who then tempts Adam. Both wish to be like gods and choose for themselves. The effect of the sin brought about the downfall of others. The results are disastrous; the relationship with God is broken, their own relationship is damaged and they feel shame. They find it hard to look at each other. They will be expelled from the Garden of Eden and will need to work for their living and experience the suffering of hard labor and toil.

Remarkably, God does not forget them and is abundantly merciful to them, because God wants them to find a way back into His love. There is an ancient legend that said that Adam and Eve's third son, Seth, later returns to the gates of the Garden of Eden and asks God's angel to help them. The angel gives Seth some seeds, one of which he places in the mouth of Adam as he lies dying. From this seed God will bring about the new Adam, Christ, who will be born of the Virgin Mary. He will be tempted but will conquer the devil. We receive the hope that we can do the same with God's grace. God is always planting new seeds in our hearts. The Lord forgives us when we turn to Him in the sacrament of reconciliation and our hearts are cleansed.

Lent is about the expansion of the heart so that it becomes more loving and generous. Just as the heart muscle benefits from exercise, so too will our spiritual heart benefit from the Lenten observances and practices.

First of all, prayer opens the heart and helps us to listen to God's word. When we allow the word to echo in our hearts and to penetrate down into its depths, it will help us grow in knowledge of God's mercy and love. Secondly, the invitation to fast expands our hearts so that we become more aware of ways that we so often focus on satisfying our own needs and desires rather than being willing to open our hearts to our neighbor. Fasting can make us more grateful for what we have received and more generous to others in their need. Lastly, we can develop our Lenten exercises by giving to others, especially through almsgiving and charitable works. This exercise helps us focus on the needs of our neighbor. By the end of Lent, with plenty of exercise, our spiritual heart will be in better shape and more ready to resist temptation and place its trust in God.

### ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2017 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February March 5, 2017 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 11, 2017.**

**\*Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

### LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES, 2017

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** In the Chapel on Fridays at 2:00 P.M., (except First Friday, March 3); and in the Church at 6:45 P.M. (English); 7:45 P.M. (Italian), every Friday during Lent.

On Good Friday, April 14, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

**RECONCILIATION:** Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, April 15, which is Holy Saturday); every Wednesday night during Lent from 7:00-8:00 in the Chapel.

**LENTEN DAILY MASSES:** There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

### **EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST:**

Every Friday, Exposition of the Eucharist is 9:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., concluding with Benediction.

On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.

First Friday, April 7, with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M., at which time there will be Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, and Mass immediately follows.

### **MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS**

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross.

The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, March 26, 2017.

**FASTING & ALMSGIVING:** Operation Rice Bowls, which are distributed in today's bulletin and are also available in the Church vestibule, help to support Catholic Relief Services care for the poor in developing countries. Please use the calendar and eat a *simpler* meal each week (fasting) and place your sacrifice (alms), the money you save in terms of eating a simpler meal, and return your sacrifice in the envelope provided on Palm Sunday, April 9th. "Let us eat simply so that others may simply eat."

### **FORMATION**

- Suggested Lenten penances will be distributed on Ash Wednesday and each Sunday of Lent as a way of reminding us to make our pledge to enter into these forty days of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, truly a time of Penance and conversion of the heart.
- Bible Study on Thursday evenings, 7:30 P.M., in the St. Joseph Center. There is no Bible Study on Holy Thursday.

Please note that the Mother Cabrini Chapel will be open every day from **6:45 AM until 9:00 PM** for your own private prayer time and devotions.

### **2017 Stewardship Project - Needed: New or Used Communion Dresses and Suits**

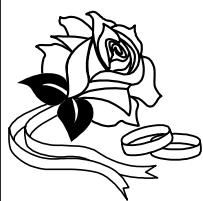
