



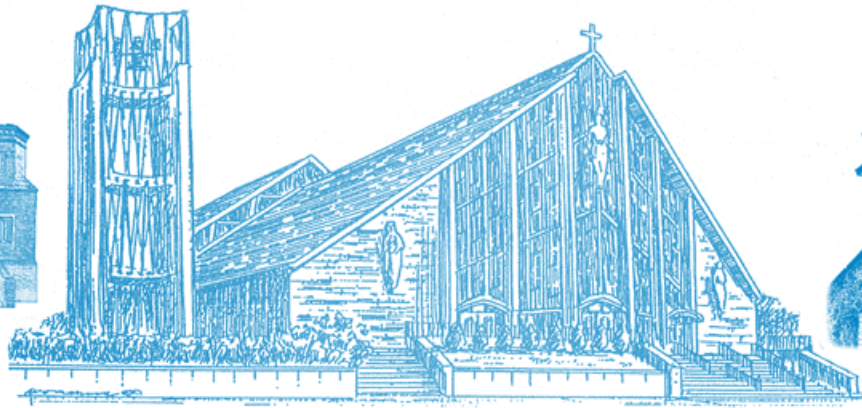

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

**5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent 2017 - A**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Jesus talks about death in today’s gospel, not in cosmic apocalyptic events but, rather, in close loving relationships. We learn that His dear friends, Martha and Mary, inform Him about their sick brother, Lazarus, whom Jesus loves. At first Jesus seems indifferent and delays going to help but then reassures them that the illness will not end in death; yet the disciples are told that Lazarus is only sleeping and Jesus corrects them and states quite starkly, “Lazarus is dead.” What Saint John now shows us in this passage is how a believer can come to a deeper faith in the face of death.

Martha is told her brother will rise again and she presumes that this will be on the final day. But then Jesus says, “I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live.” Then He asks Martha, as well as all of us, “Do you believe this?” Martha affirms her faith in Jesus as the Christ and the Son of God but, when they finally come to the grave she seems to falter in her belief that Jesus can raise the dead. Martha says, “Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.” Even Jesus is moved to tears by the grief of those He loves and is angry as well, at the reality of death in His friend. But then Jesus performs the greatest sign of His ministry as he calls Lazarus from the grave. As Lazarus comes out, bound by the bonds of death, Jesus commands them to unbind him. Lazarus is freed from death.

The rising of Lazarus is the greatest sign Jesus performs but, like the other signs we have seen during this Season of Lent, the giving of the “living water” to a thirsty woman and sight to the blind man, it points out a greater reality of the resurrection, which we celebrate at Easter. Lazarus was raised from the dead but he had to die again. He would again need the funeral cloths that are cast aside when Jesus rises on the third day. At the resurrection, Jesus conquers death. At baptism we receive the grace of an eternal life that cannot be touched by death. In that sense we experience eternity now. But death, as an enemy, still remains and we must all finally face it, although confident that we shall share in the resurrection of our bodies on the last day.

When we celebrate the funerals of our loved ones, we need to express in the liturgy both the triumph of Christ’s victory and the sadness of the present reality of the loss that death brings. On the last day, our faith calls us to believe that Christ will come again in glory and bring His creation to share fully in His resurrection. But what we can witness to in our celebration of the sacraments, especially in the Eucharist, is that the risen Christ is now present among us. And the good news is that we can offer to a secular world a faith that our loved ones who have died will share in that final victory.

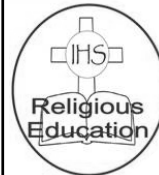
**MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA**
