My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The mystery of Jesus' empty tomb has continued to fascinate throughout the centuries. Mary Magdalene is the first to discover that it is empty. She naturally assumes that someone must have removed His body and that is what she tells Peter and the *other disciple*, whom tradition names as John.

When they get to the tomb, John hesitates. He stands at the entrance of the tomb and sees the reality but, almost like a good archeologist, he is reluctant to enter the tomb and disturb anything in it. Peter goes straight in and also sees the reality but we are not told what he actually makes of it. However, when John finally enters the tomb, something happens within him. Even without seeing the Risen Christ, it suddenly makes sense to him; he sees and he believes. It's not the Risen Lord that he sees, just clues of His resurrection. Mary Magdalene had seen those same clues and assumed that the body of Jesus had been taken away. It's only when she actually *sees* the Risen Lord that she comes to believe. John is able to accept this awesome truth simply from the fact of the empty tomb, from the fragments of Jesus' burial cloths and also, surely, from the fragments of his memory of Jesus' teaching on the resurrection from the dead.

The words of Mary Magdalene, "They have taken my Lord and I don't know where they have taken Him," are the words of every woman and every man. There are times in our life when we feel the desolation of loss, that is, the loss of loved ones, the loss of hope, the loss of faith, and when the Lord Himself indeed has been taken away from us. But these early stories of the resurrection speak to us of the dynamics of how we come to faith. Peter sees the empty tomb but says nothing. He needs more time, more experience, before he can come to full faith and understanding. Peter remains open to the possibility of this truth he is witnessing. John, we see, is able to cross the threshold of faith by holding his sense of loss and his experience of emptiness of the tomb on one hand, and bringing it into connection with his memory of the Lord on the other. That is surely what happens to us in prayer, especially during times of pain and grief. Our experience of loss, together with our "memory" of the Lord as we come to Him in prayer, somehow leads us to deeper faith. John sees nothing but hints and signs, but this is enough to lead him to believe. Mary Magdalene sees the emptiness and keeps on searching. It is her persevering love of Jesus that leads her to be the first to encounter Him in person, when she hears Jesus speak her name and He sends her as the apostle to the apostles, to bring them the news of His resurrection.

An empty tomb is not proof of resurrection. Religious scholars may argue over it, but our faith does not rest on physical proof. St. Paul tells the Colossians, "The life you have hidden with Christ is God." It's not in the tomb that we will find the proof we seek. The resurrection, our encounter with the Risen Lord, can actually only happen within the chamber of our own hearts. That is where we meet Him today, in our searching, in our prayer, in our pain and in our persevering love.

On behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco, Fr. Mathew, Fr. Bill, Msgr. Ziccardi and I, we wish all of you a blessed and joyous Easter Season. May the Risen Lord fill your hearts with love and many spiritual blessings.

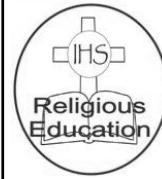
