MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

Palm Sunday

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Ever since the earliest day, the idea of a pilgrimage has had an important place in the life of the Christian Church. One reason may be that the Cross, central to Christian life and faith, is a sort of journey, a difficult journey, but one filled with grace. The idea of a difficult journey in itself is worthwhile and has found its way into the heart of Christian life. All through her history, the Church has made pilgrimages, finding ways to make visible the nature of the Church's life as a journey.

The different Gospels we listen to on Sundays are themselves a pilgrimage. The different Gospels of Passion Sunday describe the Passion of Christ in different ways, in order to emphasize different aspects of the event. For Saint Mark, one of the central factors is the refusal of Christ to be the kind of Messiah the crowd thought He should be. For Saint Luke, the emphasis is on the mercy of Christ; we have the women who weep for Christ and the good thief who repents on the cross. For Saint John, it is the broken love between the Father and the Son, which is not obscured but revealed by His Passion.

For Saint Matthew, whose depiction of Jesus' Passion which we heard today, it is more difficult. One reason for this is that the entire Gospel of Matthew is written as a continuous sequence, with Jesus preaching to the Jews at the Sermon on the Mount and, after His own people rejected His mission, leading to the resounding command at the end of the Gospel to "Go therefore, make disciples of all the nations, baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." Of all the Gospels, Saint Matthew is the one which needs to be read from beginning to end in order to be properly understood. And yet Matthew is also good at breaking out of sequence with hints of what is to come. So the Magi in the infancy narrative shows, ultimately, the mission of Jesus is for the entire world, not only for the Jews. The mockery from the soldiers shows what will happen, in reality, when Christ returns as King. The holy ones rise from their tombs to show the resurrection of all the dead and this connects with the death of Christ with the past and the future.

Saint Matthew is the most orderly of the Gospels, yet it is also a Gospel of interruptions. The Magi at the beginning and the holy ones who rise at the end, show that life cannot be kept sealed in a box. Eternity itself interrupts life. When we experience the Cross, we also experience the resurrection. Life on earth is never far from heaven, yet heaven appears in some of the most un-heavenly places. Matthew is an example of someone whose orderly as a tax collector was interrupted by the call of Jesus. Matthew teaches us not to be so orderly as to set up barriers to the incoming grace of God.

As we enter this Holy Week, we reflect on Jesus' journey to the Cross and through the cross of eternal life. And we can reflect that whatever difficulties we may face in our journey through this life, He is always with us, and our ultimate destination is the same.

Today we invite you to join in procession beginning at 11:15AM from the Holy Family Day Nursery to the Church for the 12:00 Noon Mass, as we profess our faith publically and commemorate the Passion of our Lord Jesus. We remind you that the final opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions) will be this Tuesday, April 11, 7:00 PM, at the Communal Penance Service celebrated at Saint Mary's Church, Nutley, and here, at Holy Family, on Wednesday, 7:00-8:00 PM, in the Mother Cabrini Chapel. There are no confessions on Holy Saturday.

All are invited Monday evening, April 10, 8:00 PM, to the Cathedral Basilica for the Chrism Mass, celebrated by our new Archbishop, Cardinal Tobin. At this beautiful Liturgy, the clergy recommit themselves to their ministry and Cardinal Tobin will consecrate the Sacred Oils used for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and Sacrament of the Sick, which are used in all the parishes throughout the Archdiocese. Please check the bulletin for our Mass schedule for Holy Week. Be reminded there are no morning Masses on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Morning Prayer of the Church will be prayed on those days at 9:00AM. Due to the Chrism Mass on Monday evening – Novena prayers will be prayed in Church following the 8:45 Mass.

The Parish Center Chapel will be open for private prayer during this Holy Week. There is NO ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT ON GOOD FRIDAY.

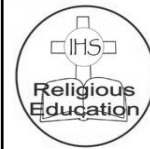
