



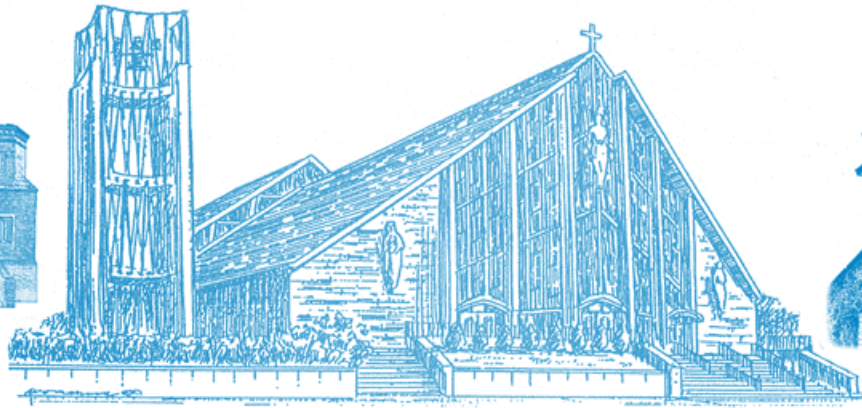

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

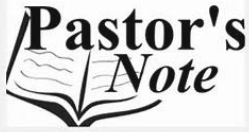

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The part of Saint John's Gospel from which we read today, gives us an intimate insight into how Jesus speaks with His Father. Very few places in the Scriptures have this beautiful unity so magnificently displayed. It is our privilege to stand by Jesus and listen to all He has to say. We hear Him speak of glory, of eternal life, of His own pre-existence, of prayer and of our own good selves. This is the essence of our Lord's mission and ministry and we are being given this opportunity to hear it all from His own mouth as the words

fall from His lips. If we use our hearts wisely to begin to understand all of what Jesus says, then we have a very good chance of being the followers He really wants.

Even imagining Jesus sitting there with His eyes raised to heaven can be a truly wonderful thing to do. If this is Jesus at prayer, and it surely is, than we, too, can be filled with awe and expectation. When the disciples saw Jesus praying like this earlier in the Gospel, they were compelled to ask to be taught how to pray. Perhaps this can be part of our own experience today.

Being inspired to pray, or asking how to pray, is a very good position to be in as a result of today's Gospel; however, when we look it again we see that there is much more. Jesus speaks to the Father about us. We hear as Jesus describes who we are, namely, we belong to the Father. Jesus says, "They were yours and you gave them to me." Then He goes on to say, "I pray for them." How often we think about the prayers we've raised to heaven; but here our attention is being turned to Jesus praying for us.

This Easter Season is now coming to its end and it seems as if the Gospel is trying to teach us a lesson about the importance of listening. Without the ability to listen reverently we would never have heard the closeness of Jesus to the Father and, indeed, what He thinks of us. We might have never guessed that Jesus prays for us. However, it is all there in the Gospel, if only we pay attention to it and listen reverently. Listening is one thing; however, to do it with reverence is the key that will surely enable us to hear the message.

Today we might think about how well we do listen. Sometimes we think that we are very good listeners but this could be far from true. Other times we can be so busy that there is never time to listen as loved ones want to share their joys and sorrows with us. There are many different ways in which we listen. Do we listen reverently to our family and friends or do we think we know what they will say so why bother? Do we listen in church to the Word of God, or to the homilist, or do we think we will only get bored so why bother? The decision is ours. But what we get from the words may depend on how well we do listen.

Last Sunday, May 21, Deacons were ordained for the Church of Newark. Among them was Deacon Marco Vetrano who served here as seminarian the past couple of years. Marco is from Palermo, Sicily. His parents and sisters came from Sicily for this great celebration. Yesterday, May 27, men were ordained for the Church of Newark to the Priesthood; among them, Fr. Michele Pedroni from Brescia, Italy, who has served here as seminarian. Fr. Pedroni was assigned to St. Peter's in Belleville. His parents and siblings have also travelled from Italy for this great celebration. Next weekend, Deacon Nicholas Apolloniok, who served here as a seminarian, will be ordained for the Church of Brooklyn, NY. He is from Trieste, Italy, and his parents will be travelling for this beautiful celebration.

We, too, have been blessed; Rev. Mr. (Deacon) Anthony Di Stefano (*pronounced Dee Stefano*), has been assigned to our parish for a year as a transitional deacon. God willing, He will be ordained to the priesthood next May. Deacon Anthony will begin his ministry with us after Memorial Day.

Let us pray for these men who will begin in the ordained ministry to serve the people of God. We pray for them and may God bless them as they begin their assignments. Let us also pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially from our own families.

We congratulate Fr. Francesco! As was announced at Masses last weekend, Fr. Francesco is officially a citizen of the United States of America!!!

Also, congratulations are in order for Fr. Mauro, who has completed his studies and is now a part-time advocate for the Marriage Tribunal in the Archdiocese of Newark, on a Deanery level. Congratulations to both of you; we are happy and proud of you both!
