BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

When life begins for any of us, the most important first gifts we receive are not the materialistic gifts but, rather, the nurturing gifts. We need the presence of those who love us. We need the daily nourishment of food so that we may grow strong. And we need the joy, interest and the stimulus of others, our extended family and friends, who will introduce us to the world.

When Jesus began His own family, which was His community of disciples, His first gift to them was His very presence. They lived with Him day and night. Each day they grew in their understanding of Him and who He was. His presence inspired them and gave them joy and hope for life. He fed them with every word He said and the people flocked to hear what He would say. This Word was truly nourishing to their lives. A new company was born into the world, the followers of Jesus, and it was the Word of Jesus and the presence of Jesus that nourished and formed His family. His crowning gift to them on the night He was betrayed was to give Himself in a sacred sign, in bread and wine. His presence among us would now take the form of a sacred and sacrificial meal, a sacramental gift to bind His Church together. Present in these signs, in His Word and in the bread and wine, the Lord would preserve and nourish His Church throughout the ages. His followers, now called His friends, indeed His brothers and sisters, would become the living presence of the Lord in the world.

St. Paul, in his writings to the Galatians, said of his own life, "I live now, not with my own life but with the life of Christ who lives in me." This is the life that the Lord invites us constantly to live. By receiving the body and blood of Christ into ourselves, we can become part of that living Lord in His world. The first manifestation of this is our human presence to others. To be present to others is a simple and powerful act of self-giving. To be present to others, in an attentive and kindly manner, is to allow the grace of the Lord to be there at work in the world.

The second manifestation of Christ is in our speaking. Whenever our words are kind and thoughtful, patient and understanding, then the Word of God is alive and active through us. People's lives are nourished by the words they hear from us.

The third gift of Christ to the world comes through the sharing of love and affection, kindness and consideration. The company of the Lord, His friends, live by this spirit.

And so it is this day; the Feast of Corpus Christi is truly the feast of life's fullness. The presence of the Lord among us, the gift of Himself in the holy sacrament of His Body and Blood, and the joy of being part of His company, the Church, is what we celebrate today; gathered together, fed by His word, and sent out into the world.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the heart of today's solemnity is a Eucharistic procession, held in many parishes, that calls to mind the procession of Holy Thursday, yet has a purpose different from the somber adoration in the night watch. In the late Middle Ages, a procession through the city with the Blessed Sacrament was an occasion of heartfelt joy and great emotion. In a time when people seldom approached the altar to receive Holy Communion, the procession through the streets, past homes and workplaces, was a vibrant reminder that Christ was with them as a dear companion and guide.

Every year on this day, a joyful procession winds through the streets of Rome from the Lateran cathedral. A few years ago, Pope John Paul II, deeply moved at the sight of the throng accompanying the sacred host, said that we ought to feel profoundly united with the faithful everywhere in the world at such a moment. "Before our mind's eye all the Churches of the world, from East to West, from North to South, are present." Originally this feast was on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but after the calendar reform of 1970, its title was expanded from "Corpus Christi" to "The Body and Blood of Christ" and in the United States it was moved to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. Even though Easter season ended two weeks ago, this beautiful feast is aglow with Easter light.

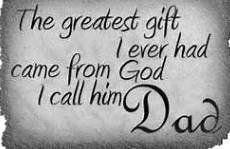

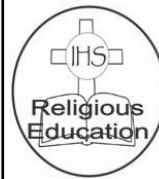

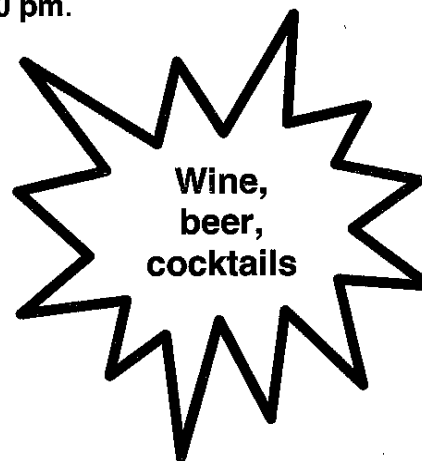
