MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

From the
Pastor’s Desk

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2017-A

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

There are so many Gospel episodes where Jesus tells His disciples not to be afraid. In Luke, Jesus said: “There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom.” In Matthew and Mark, after calming the storm at sea, Jesus asks His disciples why they had been so frightened. In John, during the Last Supper discourse, Jesus says twice, “Do not let your hearts be troubled.” And on a second occasion, He adds, “...or afraid.”

In today’s Gospel, however, there is a specific reason why His disciples should not be afraid. Jesus says to them, “Everything that is now covered will be uncovered.” On Jesus’ lips, these words were a reassurance that the day would come when it would be clear just who Jesus was and what He had achieved in dying and rising from the dead. In the ears of the Gospel’s first listeners, it would have also been an encouragement during the terrible opposition and persecution that they faced from their former fellow synagogue-attendees.

There may have been a puzzle here for both sets of listeners, however, one that remains, to this day, is who Jesus means by *the one to be feared because he has the power to “destroy both body and soul in hell?”* There is an automatic tendency to assume that this must be the devil and this has been a traditional approach. However, the devil has no power to cast into hell; he only can tempt and cause serious mischief. The only person who could possibly have that power is God. The fear of God is a common expression of piety in the Scriptures but we can reflect on what it just might mean. Before we do this, it is important to remember that Jesus began this speech with the words, “Do not be afraid.” So, whatever fear of the Lord is, it is certainly not being afraid of God.

Traditionally, we designate one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit as *the fear of God*. Here, again, we see an anomaly because being afraid is not much of a gift. In more recent times, there has been a tendency to express this gift as *wonder and awe in God’s presence*. Certainly, wonder and awe describes how we should sit in the presence of the God who has the power to destroy body and soul in hell, but who has chosen to give us the kingdom. This is truly wonderful. It inspires us to the awe of silence, or the sigh too deep for words, which St. Paul tells us the Spirit uses to intercede for us when our words fail.

The rest of what Jesus has to say continues in the same vein. It may not, at first, sound very comforting to be told that we are worth more than hundreds of sparrows, but Jesus telling us that no one ever escapes the watchful eye of the God of infinite love, who never lets us out of sight, is the God who could never forget the number of hairs on our heads.





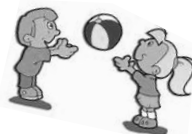
