13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2017-A

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran pastor and a theologian. He is considered one of the greatest Christian heroes of the last century. In his native land of Germany, he argued forcefully against Adolf Hitler's euthanasia program as well as his genocidal attack on the Jewish community. Because of this opposition, Bonhoeffer was imprisoned, later sent to a concentration camp and, finally, toward the end of the war, was executed by the Nazis. There was a doctor present at his execution who recorded how he was moved by the calm and prayerful spirit in which this heroic pastor faced his death.

In 1937 Bonhoeffer had written a book called *The Cost of Discipleship*, which has become a modern spiritual classic. In this book, he warns against the notion of "cheap grace." He describes cheap grace as, "...grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ..." The cheap grace approach emphasizes the more attractive and consoling aspects of Christianity, with little or no reference to the demands made upon those who follow Christ. Bonhoeffer insists that to leave out the difficult aspects of Christianity such as repentance, discipline, confession, discipleship, and the cross, is to offer an incomplete version, a "cheap version" of God's grace and discipleship.

Bonhoeffer's views reflect what we have heard from Jesus in today's Gospel. He made no bones about it: following Him makes demands of us, for He must be the center of our life, no matter what the cost. By way of extreme example, He insists that even the most precious relationships, such as those between parents and children must not be allowed to come between us and Him. Of course, this does not mean that the bonds of love within a family are of no importance. On the contrary, they are of supreme importance, and yet we cannot allow even these to become a barrier between us and our responsibility to God.

We might reflect on the life of the martyr, Saint Thomas More. He was an outstanding family man. When he was imprisoned for refusing to take the oath that would have acknowledged King Henry VIII as head of the Church in England, his wife and beloved daughter pleaded with him to find some way of saving his life and being able to return home. He wrestled with his conscience but he knew that he must remain faithful only to the Lord. It was only in that way that he could reassure his family that they would happily meet one day in heaven. St. Thomas More's words serve as a reminder to us that if the first part of today's Gospel insists that we agree to put God first, the second part assures us that our efforts will never go unrewarded. Those who welcome a prophet or offer to help any of the "little ones," even if it is "only a cup of water," will receive their reward. Those who serve their sisters and brothers in need are, in fact, welcoming Jesus and, in welcoming Him, welcome the one who sent Him, the Father in heaven.

There is no such thing as cheap grace. It should not surprise us that in following Jesus, who took up His cross, there will inevitably be something of the cross in our lives as well. It is always a costly business to live in a truly Christian way; at times it makes painful demands on us that go against our instinctive desires; it sometimes makes us feel that we are out of step with the rest of the world, that we are losing out on life. But Jesus makes an extraordinary promise; He said: "Anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it." Whatever the losses, the profits will be greater.

No one makes the point more powerfully than St. Paul. Within twenty years of the death and resurrection of Jesus, St. Paul wrote to a group of Christians drawing a powerful contrast between what Christian living might look like to an outsider and what it is in reality. He said, "Though the unbelieving world may regard us as only half alive, we are in fact fully alive, with a sharing of the very life of the risen Christ." He continued by saying, "We are not sad and joyless individuals but, rather, we are always rejoicing with the deep down joy of the Gospel that nothing can take away. We may seem poor but, in fact, we are incredibly rich. It might look as though by following Jesus we are left with nothing, but the reality is we possess everything."

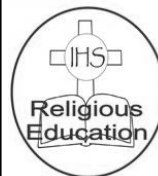
MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA
