








**15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time A-2017**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

During Jesus' time, farmers in Palestine suspended a large bag of seed from their necks and while walking up and down the field, using both hands, they threw the seed out as far as they could. Some of the seed would fall on the edge of the path, some landed on rocks, and others fell among the thorns. But some seed landed in rich soil and it produced a great crop. Our Lord's words today are one of the few parables that Jesus explains things in detail. The *seed* is the Word of God. Some of the scattered seed inevitably bear no fruit when people don't understand them, or if they get overwhelmed by trials or persecution, or get caught up with the worries of this world as well as with the materialistic or riches of the world. But the great point of the parable is that the Word of God produces a bumper crop, maybe thirty or sixty percent, and some even one hundred per cent. It is powerful and therefore, the Palestinians thought they had done well if their seed yielded seven per cent. Ten per cent was considered a great harvest and thirty per cent was unheard of. Perhaps Jesus had His mother in mind when He spoke of a hundredfold response. She, above all others, heard the Word of God and kept it. From the moment Mary spoke the words: "Let it be done unto me according to your word," she never, for a moment, deviated from that fidelity and love and, most of all trust.

We might ponder upon this thought and ask ourselves where we are in all of this. If we are tempted to think that we belong among the seed that fell on the edge of the path, or on the rocks, or among the weeds, we might want to think again. Because Jesus did not relate this parable to discourage us but, rather, the reverse; that is to emphasize that there is no limit to what God's grace can do within us, what God can make of us, and what goodness and fruit can God produce.

Of course we are realistically aware of our faults for as St. Paul said, "All of us who possess the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free." There is a struggle and breaking away from the things that hold us back. We may fall but we can get up again, praying that God forgives us and has mercy on us. The saints, like our Blessed Mother, never look down on us with our thirty or sixty per cent. They do not see us as failures. The fact is that we all vary. Some go on to become wonderful saints; we ask them to pray for us and we can learn more from them as role models. There are other people, maybe not saints, whom we none the less admire for their goodness, love and kindness. But in all the struggles and temptations of our life, Jesus tells us never to be discouraged. Sometimes we might feel that we are just hanging on to Jesus by our fingertips but, in reality, He is the one holding on to us because He loves us. As the Lord declared to Isaiah, "The word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do." Mary said the same: "Nothing is impossible to God." We must remember that always.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Two centuries ago, Archbishop John Carroll worried that Americans would not appreciate the linguistic veil over our worship, and asked that the liturgy in the new United States be in English, not Latin. How did our liturgy come to be in Latin in the first place? In the first century, the dominant language in the regions where the church first flourished was Greek. Today in much of the world, almost everyone speaks at least a bit of English. Recently, the European Union even considered making English its official language, a curious proposal since only two English-speaking countries are members.

Just as English is a unifying language today, it was hard to function in the ancient world without a smattering of Greek. Even the word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek for "thanksgiving." For a long time, Greek was the language of worship, even in Rome. Slowly, society in the west shifted to a bias for Latin and against Greek. Latin first appeared in public prayer at the end of the second century, in the colonial outposts of North Africa. Soon, Latin became the language of culture, and so as fixed prayer forms were written, they were transmitted in Latin. From Rome and Africa, over the next four centuries, the new liturgical language of Latin spread north to Gaul and Britain.



**The "Differences" Between the Baby in the Womb and the Newborn Baby**

There are four "differences" between the baby in the mother's womb (or so-called fetus) who has no protection under the law from a newborn baby, who is protected:

1. **Size** The baby in the womb is usually smaller than newborns. The question, then, is what does size have to do with rights of personhood? The answer: nothing.
2. **Level of Development** Babies in the womb are less developed than a newborn (unless the newborn is born prematurely). Again this has no moral significance. Children are generally less developed than adults and all human beings continue to develop and change throughout our entire lives. It is humanity, not brain capacity or strength that determines personhood.
3. **Location** The baby in the womb has a different place of residence. Again this is irrelevant because personhood stems from being a human being, not from your location.
4. **Dependency** Abortion protagonists love to argue that, "since a fetus cannot survive on its own, it has no inherent right to life." The problem with this argument is that to varying degrees, we are all dependent on others. Moreover, newborn babies and small children are absolutely dependent upon their parents for survival. What is absurd about this line of thinking is the fact that dependency should merit more protection under the law, not less! We are all far more outraged, for example, at violence towards children than at violence towards other adults. The reason is obvious. Children are more helpless and innocent and less capable of defending themselves than adults. The child in the mother's womb is the most helpless and innocent and the least capable of defending themselves.

That is precisely why we must fight to protect them!

**The Continuing Commitment to Protect Children and Young People**

As part of the Archdiocese of Newark's continuing commitment to protect children and young people, this past year, the Office of Child and Youth Protection conducted over 400 Protecting God's Children training programs. Since 2003, over 52,000 employees, volunteers, and clergy have been trained to help prevent child abuse. In addition, all those who continue to work with children must recertify their training every three years.
