Tobin, Archbishop of Newark, preside at our closing Mass and joining us in procession through the streets, as well as enjoying the wonderful food our parish chefs prepared for this fun-filled spiritual weekend. I am grateful to all who helped in making our liturgy so beautiful, especially our choir, servers, readers, ministers, ushers, all important ingredients to make everything so special. Cardinal Tobin enjoyed the hospitality our parishioners extended to him.

Lots of love and, most of all, hard work goes into running this festival. The special gifts of Time, Talent and Treasure of Heart, for the benefit of our parish and honoring Our Lady of Sorrows, and for the honor and glory of God makes this annual event so worthwhile. I am most especially grateful to Gina and Alex Tamburri for all their hard work and patience in overseeing and making sure every detail, no matter how big or how small, was taken care of perfectly. The volunteers, who were relied upon daily during the past several months, worked so hard to make every element come together. All those who gave of their time during the course of the Festival did a spectacular job preparing, cooking, serving, cleaning up. I give thanks to our heavenly Father for the perfect weather we enjoyed during these days. I was becoming distracted with the possibilities of the effects of hurricanes and rainy weather during these days but God is truly good and blessed us with the best weather we ever had in the 26 years of the celebration! Let us not forget to continue praying for all of our brothers and sisters in Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico and the many islands, who have suffered the effects and lost so much during this year's hurricane season.

In today's Gospel message we find Jesus speaking to the chief priests and elders of the people. His words to them are somewhat alarming, as well as challenging, and especially to those who claim religious faith. Jesus gives them a scenario and leaves them to find the appropriate answers. He begins by simply asking, "What is your opinion? A man has two sons..." and so begins that interrogation. Both the sons in the parable answer their father; one chooses not to tell the truth, saying he will go to work but, in reality, he does not. The other tells the truth saying he does not want to go to work but then, in fact, changes his mind and does the work his father asked him to do.

The point Jesus is making becomes quite obvious very quickly; He does not allow us to carry on the journey without first understanding His meaning. He goes on to tell the assembled that when John the Baptist came among them, as an example and model of "true righteousness," the people of religion and holy talk did not believe him. At the same time, however, "the tax collectors and the prostitutes" were making their way into the kingdom of God before them.

It's not difficult to imagine the reaction to Jesus' words among these people. It surely would not be difficult for us, as well, to try and imagine our reaction to the words of Jesus if they were addressed to us. How we receive them depends on how we perceive ourselves and on how we see and judge others.

When you think about it, in our very own community, Sunday after Sunday, we allow ourselves to be fooled into thinking that we are good and holy people while the many poor souls who never darken the doors of a church are the castaways of God, outside of God's love. This is exactly what Jesus was dealing with in His own day. We can learn from this Gospel passage and put away the arrogant thoughts that might accompany us on our way to church.

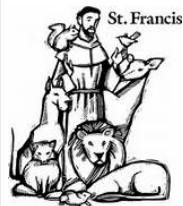
There is no reason for us to become self-righteous or self-obsessed with regard to our religion and our God. Saint Paul tells us that even though Jesus was in the form of God, He emptied Himself. We are to do the same, we need to empty ourselves and allow God to fill us. In doing so, we will not be shocked that tax collectors and prostitutes are going into heaven before us; rather, we will instead rejoice.

Again, on behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco, Deacon Anthony and me, we thank God for the gift of you in our lives.

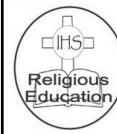

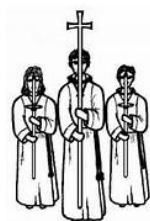

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniquilvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5<sup>th</sup> century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

All you need to do is to come and listen and/or invite those who have distanced themselves from the Lord and might benefit from this experience.
