



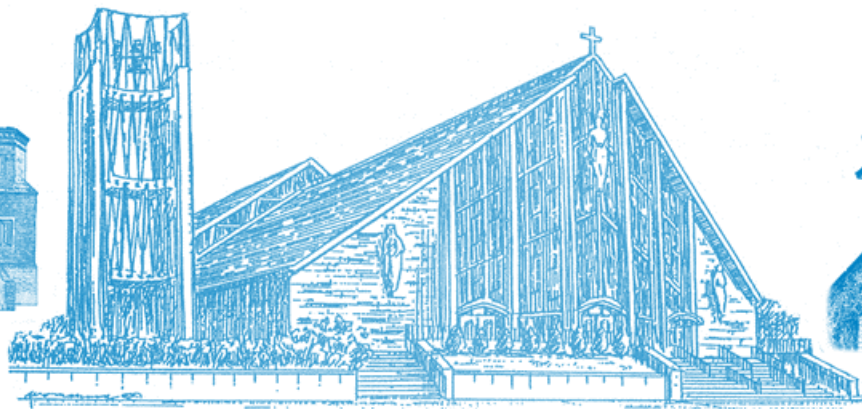

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we look at today's Gospel passage from St. Matthew, we find that it is all about the way Jesus wants His Church to function. Today's passage focuses on *exclusion*. The question is posed as what to do if a member does something wrong. You need to follow a process of charity. Do you go straight to the top authority and report the person? Well, no, you might begin a bit more personally by speaking to the person who has offended you. Only after that has failed

do you call others in for help and, if that doesn't work, you appeal to the whole community. Finally, as a last resort, you may have to expel the person. And this decision is ratified by God with His words, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven." This might seem a bit severe but we have to look at this passage in its full context and what is on either side of this teaching about excommunication.

Before the passage, Jesus tells us that we are called to seek out the lost sheep and leave behind the other ninety nine. God does not want even a single sinner to be lost. After the passage, we have Jesus telling Peter that he must forgive his brother not just seven times but seventy- seven times. God's forgiveness is unlimited so how do we reconcile these opposites; the judgement and the exclusion of the sinner and yet God's desire to embrace and save all of God's creatures? In any community, such tensions are inevitable; there must always be boundaries and sin has to be identified or it cannot be forgiven. However, we are called to always remember that at the heart of this community is the presence of Jesus. "For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be with them." And the God who reveals Himself in Jesus Christ does indeed pass judgment but shows that His preference is for the exercise of mercy and forgiveness.

These tensions can be seen at home as well as at church. We might ask ourselves what happens if parents are severe and always condemning their children? And what happens if they indulge and accept everything their children do, no matter how wrong - - both alternatives are inadequate. Boundaries have to be set in any community so that people know right from wrong. Forgiveness can never be preached with real authority without preaching of repentance and judgment.

We must be very careful if we find ourselves deciding how the God of Jesus Christ ought to behave. The Gospel shows how often the Lord bursts the boundaries that have been set up by human beings and reaches out in love and mercy to seek out the lost and to embrace the outcast. In the *Year of Mercy* we remembered that more people have been turned away from the Church by its severity and exclusion than by its forgiveness and mercy. And we could learn from that lesson in the way we live together in our homes as well as in our churches.

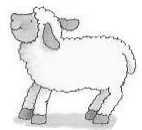

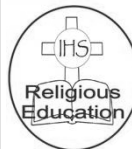

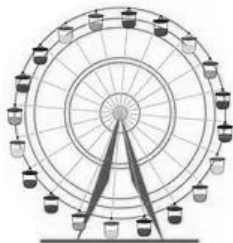
