



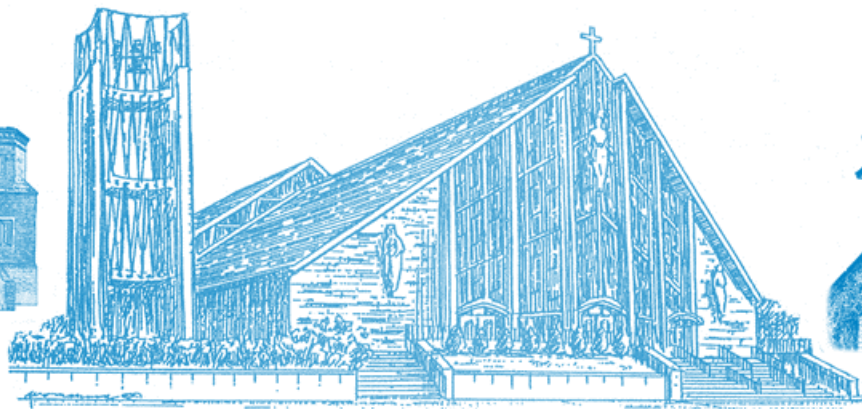

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As you read this message today, I will be in Rome praying for you as I concelebrate Mass in St. Peter's Square in the company of our Holy Father Pope Francis. Today is a special day for the people of Acri, Cosenza, Italy, the home of my family roots; my mother and her family, both my maternal and paternal grandparents, as well many families from our own parish of Holy Family. We have been waiting for this great day for many years. It is a historical moment, not only for our home town of Acri but, most especially, for Holy Mother Church. I am truly honored and humbled to be part of this magnificent day, not only for my own family but also for my family of Holy Family Parish. May our Patron, Blessed Saint Angelo of Acri, pray for us.

In the Gospel we hear today, Jesus presents a very strange story about a royal wedding. Servants hand-delivered personal invitations to the wedding of a king's son but, as we see, none of the invited guests attended. When the banquet was ready, the king sent more servants to invite another group of guests to come. Not only did the guests make many lame excuses but they beat and killed the servants who delivered the invitations. Then the story becomes really bizarre. The king, who has become furious, dispatched his troops to burn the town where the murderers lived. Afterwards, the king sent another group of servants out into streets to invite anyone at all, good and bad alike, in order to fill the banquet hall with guests.

Today's theme is a familiar one of failure of God's chosen people to respond to what was expected of them and their replacement by others who did. It is a peculiar story but those who first heard it would know some things we may not. They would know that the first servants sent out were the prophets Moses, Elijah, Elisha, and others whose messages were ignored. The second servants were more prophets such as Isaiah, who, in the first readings, talked about God preparing a banquet of rich food and fine wines for all people. The prophets made many heartfelt appeals for men and women to repent and accept God's invitation to enter the kingdom of God but they were scorned and ill-treated and some of them were also killed. The sending of the troops to burn the city while the food was on the table refers to the tragedy of the year 70AD and the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans and the massacre of its inhabitants, which Jesus warned would happen because of their rejection of God's kingdom. The first readers of St. Matthew's Gospel would have had vivid memories of it.

After that, the servants went out along the roads and invited anyone they could find, good and bad alike; people who would have never expected an invitation. These Gentiles responded to their invitation with joy and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

These last servants who travelled the roads to bring in guests were the apostles and missionaries of the Church. The king told his servants to "go," the same words used in St. Matthew's Gospel when Jesus tells His apostles, "*Go and make disciples of all nations.*" They travelled beyond Jerusalem into the Gentile lands; Europe, Asia, Africa and eventually, America and Australia. These missionaries are still going out: priests, sisters and lay people, suffering hardships as St. Paul told us he did, in the second reading, inviting men and women into the kingdom of God. All of us, in different ways, are part of that mission to spread the Gospel.

The beauty of the parables is that it presents the kingdom of God as a wedding banquet, highly desirable and attractive. Moreover, the Lord freely invites us to be His guests. We do not have to be worthy; we couldn't be worthy of God's invitation. God invites both the good and the bad; God wants all of us to be there. However, we might ask ourselves why was the unfortunate man thrown out for not wearing a wedding garment? We might remember that at Baptism, a white garment is put on. We are clothed in Christ. It is a reminder that we are called to grow in the likeness of Christ which we have put on and, most importantly, to live the Gospel.

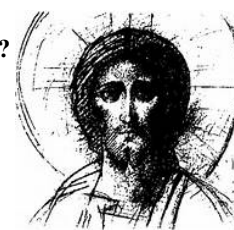

**What is the Neo-Catechumenal Way?**

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniquialvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5th century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

All you need to do is to come and listen and/or invite those who have distanced themselves from the Lord and might benefit from this experience.
