My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The American politician, Adlai Stevenson II, was born in 1900 and died in 1965. He was an able and intelligent politician and a gifted speaker. The last four years of his life he spent as US Ambassador to the United Nations. Following his death, the writer and broadcaster, Alistair Cooke, said of Stevenson, "What he left behind was something more splendid, in a public man, than a record of power. He left simply an impression of goodness. He mastered the art, far more difficult and rarer than that of a successful politician, writer, musician, actor; he left success as a human being."

As a young boy, he experienced a tragedy which devastated him. He accidentally fatally shot a sixteen year old friend while demonstrating a technique with a rifle. Many years later, he heard of a woman whose son had experienced a similar tragedy. He wrote her and told her to tell her son that he "must live for two." It is here which we have an insight into the spiritual force that lifted Stevenson into ways of justice and goodness that came to mark his life. In 1952 he said, "We will not lose faith in the United Nations. We want it to become what it was intended to be, that is a world society of nations under law, not merely backed by force, but law backed by justice and popular consent."

If you look at today's Gospel passage, you might see that the integrity and the spiritual vision of an Adlai Stevenson is missing in the characters portrayed in today's story. It is the foretelling of the deceitful and murderous intentions of Jesus' listeners, who will eventually turn to violence in order to get rid of this turbulent preacher. The story which our Lord tells describes these workers in the vineyard who, although they are tenant workers, behave as if they owned the place. The owner, who is away, sends his servants to collect the produce and these workers are not impressed. They feel that the land is theirs now because they have been doing all the work. They feel that they could make the rules. They claim by violent action what they feel belongs to them.

The parable itself will be played out most cruelly when Jesus is arrested, put on trial and then put to death. It's possible that the elders, who are listening to the story, did not believe that they themselves could be capable to do such a thing and did not recognize themselves in this story. But the story does become a reality and they did commit a crime of violence. Whenever people feel threatened by someone they quickly resort to defending themselves; what they feel is theirs whether right or wrong. These actions are justified because of fear.

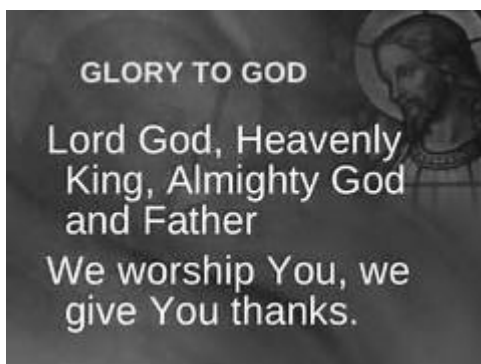
The teaching of the Lord for us today, in a world where fear shakes us, is that we persevere in goodness and never let go of it. This week we experienced the tragedy of the horrific events which happened in Las Vegas. So many senseless deaths and countless injuries sustained. Yes, the fear enters our lives as we wonder, *what next?* In the face of the forces gathering against Him, Jesus reminds His listeners of the old saying, "It was the stone that was rejected by the builders that became the corner stone." Violence will never win the day. Wrong-doing contains within itself the seed of its own destruction and the Lord who went to the cross rose that we might live.

In his writing to the Philippians, Saint Paul promotes this way of goodness today. He tells us: "Fill your minds with everything that is true. Everything can be thought virtuous. Keep doing all the things you learned from me." It is in this way that the God of peace will always be with us. This is no easy commitment and we will need strong hearts to do as Saint Paul urges us.

In our own times the temptation to act like the workers in the vineyard are ever present, to resort to the power of politics to sort out the world. We might let the words of Adlai Stevenson be heard again. He said, "The early years of the United Nations have been difficult ones, but what did we expect? That peace would drift down from the skies like soft snow? That there would be no ordeal, no anguish, no testing, in this greatest of all human undertakings?"

Let prayer be our habit so that peace may be our reward.

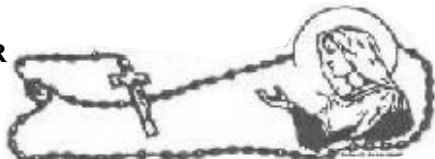

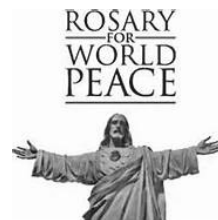

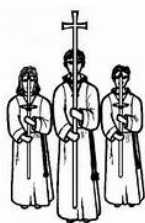

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniquilvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5th century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

All you need to do is to come and listen and/or invite those who have distanced themselves from the Lord and might benefit from this experience.
