



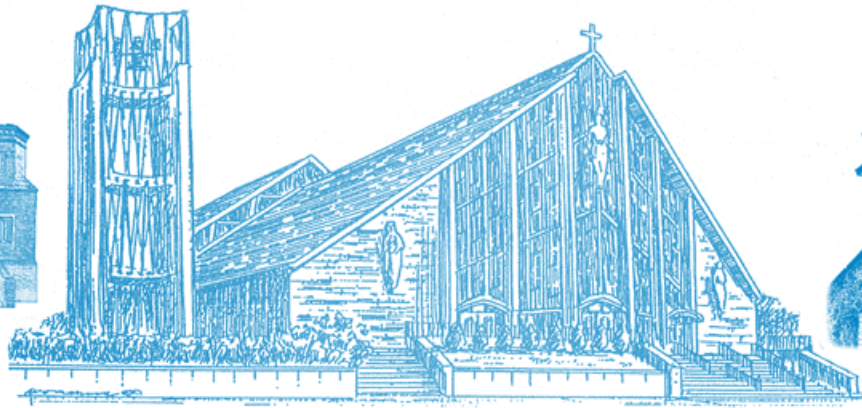

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

PASTOR'S MESSAGES



Advent 4th Sunday B-2017

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we approach the celebration of the great feast of Christmas, once again the Church is inviting us to think about our heritage. Like the Jewish people of old, Christians are generally conscious of the cherished history of our faith of the past two thousand years. It is the story of saints and sinners, struggling with complexities of life in every generation. Pope Francis encourages us to grapple with the many complexities of our own generation and recognize the presence of God in the midst of all the confusion. Like the people of the Old Testament, we may often be tempted to imagine that God has abandoned us. But in his letters, Paul is constantly reminding us that while the mystery may have been kept secret for endless ages, now it has been revealed and is accessible to everyone, including the pagans. We are part of the new inheritance, invited to be brothers and sisters of Jesus, therefore, heirs to the kingdom of God. The message announced to Mary is proclaimed again this Christmas and we are to be its heralds.

Accepted by the world as a spiritual writer and preacher, a certain monk was once asked where he learned so much about Jesus Christ. He explained that his spiritual journey started on a wrong step but that he finally came to a simple solution. He wanted to change the world in order to accept Christ but failed; then he decided to limit his goal to a small country and still he failed; he then tried to convert a small parish to accept Christ yet he failed once again. Then he came to meditate on the Gospel of St. Luke with the passage: "She wrapped Him in swaddling clothes, laid Him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn."

The King of kings, the Lord of lords came, but they failed to recognize Him, fully unaware of the coming of the Savior because they were busy with worldly cares. From that time on he confessed, "I devoted my life to letting Him stay in my heart and tried never to let anything drive Him away." This is what Christmas is all about; opening our hearts to let Jesus Christ stay, no matter what the situation is. Our heart must never close its' door to Him but always be aware of His divine presence in us.

There are so many signs and symbols that should lead us to Him. During this past week, a group of volunteers began decorating the church. The Pavone/Foti Family set up the Crib. The Knights of Columbus, with volunteers, set up the trees. I arranged the garland and wreathes while other volunteers arranged the flowers. Upon entering the Church, some will be amazed at the decorations while others will be simply unaware of all that took place.

Unless we see beyond the visible, it will only lead to pure curiosity that temporarily satisfies the body. These signs must go to the very souls of our lives. Let us talk about the **CRIB, THE CENTRAL FIGURE IN OUR CELEBRATION**: it represents our heart, simple and pure, the figures show no tales. The lights symbolize Christ, the Light of the world, and the pine tree is a symbol of life. The pine tree is the only tree that survives during the winter. The round wreath, a circle, a symbol of eternal life; the red poinsettias are a sign of love. We must remember that there is nothing in the Church that should fail to excite our bodies to go beyond the clouds of the unknowing.

Tomorrow we celebrate the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ. And as we celebrate God's Word made flesh in Jesus, let us look at ourselves and ask ourselves: *Is He our model? And are we truly trying to follow Him? Are we truly making the efforts to put His teaching into practice in our lives? As He is a word of good news to us, are we good news to the people with whom we live and work?* The Word became flesh and lives among us precisely so that He could become flesh in every age, in every place, in the lives of all those who claim to be His friends. We might also ask ourselves: *Will God's Word find expression in our lives and in our homes this Christmas?* Let us reflect on this as we celebrate the birth of Him, who loves us so much.

Please accept this special note of thanks from my family and me for the many prayers and well-wishes for my mom. We are going through a challenging time in our lives and we pray for her recovery; it is all according to God's plan. Your thoughts and prayers are greatly appreciated.

On behalf of Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco, Deacon Anthony and me, we wish you a blessed Christmas Season filled with His peace and love as we enter a New Year.
