MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Words cannot express the gratitude that my brothers and I have for your concern during the time of loss of our dear mother. As in all families, a mother is the glue that keeps us all together as a family. Christmas Day was difficult for us as we had dinner at mom's house, table set with her china and the house fully decorated, just as she had left it. We reminisced about all of our holidays and the love and care mom provided in making anyone who stopped by feel welcomed. We know that she peacefully went home to the Lord, her prayers being answered to slip away peacefully without realizing what happened. As I said in my homily at her funeral, mom was a woman of great faith and she placed her trust in God as she faced her many challenges in life. And she thanked Him for all the miracles and benefits she received. Mom persevered in prayer life praying for her children, grandchildren, family and friends, wanting only the best for them. She left her legacy of unconditional love for us to remember and share with others. Mom never asked for anything in return but the peace of knowing that we were all happy in all that we did. We are so grateful to God that she did not suffer but, rather, He embraced her tenderly. We are sure that with her great love for music and singing in the choir, she has joined the heavenly choir of Angels and Saints during this Christmas Season, her most favorite time of the year. Once again, we are grateful for your words of comfort, love and support and, most especially, your prayers for us during this time.

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. We have seen Christmas cards and carols, nativity plays and paintings, and all have three kings coming to worship the Lord. In Mathew's Gospel, they are called not kings but, rather, *wise men*. And although tradition tells us that there were three of them, the Gospel never states this as so. The traditional number of wise men, three, comes from the three gifts that Matthew tells us were given to the Child Jesus: *gold, frankincense and myrrh*. So, we might ask the question, who were these mysterious visitors from the east and why did they come? They sometimes were referred to as *magi* from the Greek word, *magic* (which is the origin of the word). They were pagans, magicians, astrologers and readers of the stars, rather than crowned monarchs.

The Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen gentium*, speaks of how members of other faiths are part of God's plan of salvation, and also states, "Nor is God remote from those who in shadow and images seek the unknown God, since he gives to everyone life and breath." The magi went off in search of a greater light, the uncreated light and the very source of light. Their reading of the stars succeeded on this occasion, led by God. Yet, when they reached their destination, the magi left behind their worship of the stars, and fell down to worship the one who made the stars and sun and life itself.

Two thousand years have passed since the magi travelled to Bethlehem searching for the light. Their journey cannot have been easy; the journey to Christ often is not. No doubt they had to give up a great deal to find Him but nothing was more important to them than their spiritual quest. Moreover, they grasped at the truth that while they were searching, God had been leading them. It was God who lit the star and God who encouraged them to set out because God loved them and God wanted to be found by them.

One of the things that the wise men's journey gave them was time. They reflected, they thought and, perhaps, they even prayed. That is one great benefit of a spiritual journey or pilgrimage. There is time to ponder fundamental questions and to realize that, like the wise men, deep down, whether we are Catholics or not, Christians of other churches, members of different faiths or people who are still searching to find faith, there is always something more to seek and find. It was a very significant moment when the magi fell down to worship Jesus and give Him their gifts and it is a similar moment when a person is baptized, comes into the Church or take a new step in faith.

At least once, Matthew tells us, the magi were lost on their journey; first arriving in Jerusalem rather than Bethlehem. But they were wise enough to ask the way. May our parish of Holy Family community always be ready to welcome, encourage, provide opportunities and show the way to those who are seeking, that like the magi, they may find Christ, the light of the world. We might remember that Jesus is not far from those who seek Him, for as He has told us, "The one who searches always finds."

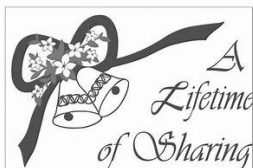

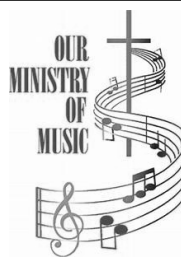
