



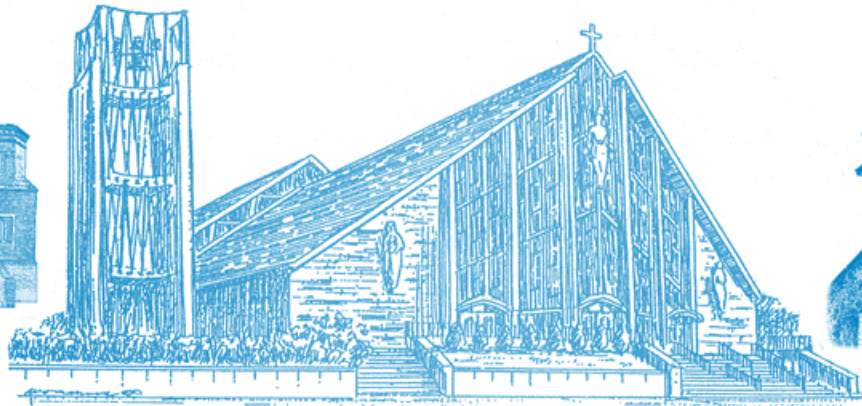

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

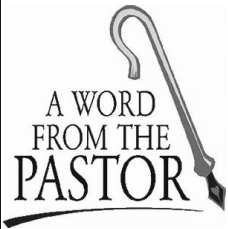

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

In today's first reading we find Job, who seems to be unable to pray with a sense of hope. He is feeling the misery of the world; he is also very pessimistic about life in general. For most people it is sheer drudgery. In his sickness, he lies on his bed and he feels a terrible restlessness as he waits for morning and then frets until evening falls. Then we turn to the Gospel and we see how the crowds who suffer like Job are drawn out of their despair by the healing touch of Jesus.

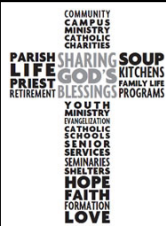
Here is a light in the gloom. Jesus has announced the kingdom and is now healing sick people and casting out devils from those who are possessed. This is why He has come to preach the message of hope to a suffering world. Jesus teaches but so often has to reach out to touch the sick people who are pressing Him for healing. So much of St. Mark's Gospel is taken up with His miracles of healing because this is what a wounded world demands. Some are dramatic exorcisms but others, as we hear today, are small and more domestic cures. He goes to Simon's house and finds Simon's mother-in-law lying in bed with a fever. He takes her by the hand, helps her up and she is healed and given new hope.

But Jesus does not want to be seen just as a wonder worker. His healing goes deeper. He forgives sins and heals spiritual sickness. At the end of His life He shares our suffering by identifying with those who are poor and outsiders. He undergoes their fate by being crucified between two criminals. It is only on the cross, after He has suffered, that Jesus will gain full recognition of being both Messiah and Son of God.

In a society which highly values those who are young, healthy and rich, the acknowledgement of sickness and even death is not always welcome. But the Bible has no qualms about facing these realities. It tells us outright that we are mortal and gives us permission to complain about our suffering just as Job did. Jesus confronts the misery of the world head on. He makes the healing of the sick people central to His ministry. By entering fully into the misery of the world through His death and resurrection, Jesus becomes for us a source of healing. Optimism is a feeling that things will get better but Christian hope is rooted in a person who has triumphed over death.

In the light of that hope we can pray to God for healing in many ways. God works through the skill of doctors and nurses in modern hospitals. But the Lord works well in our communities through His presence among us, especially through the sacraments of healing. In baptism we are washed clean, in confirmation we are strengthened in the Spirit. And in the sacrament of the sick, Christ continues His healing work among us through the laying on of the hands. And today, as we come to Mass, we are fed with the Bread of Life in Holy Communion. But we are also healed, as Peter's mother-in-law was, by care in our homes through the loving concern of our fellow Christians. Healing is not always dramatic but we are, however, called to walk slowly in hope; one step at a time.

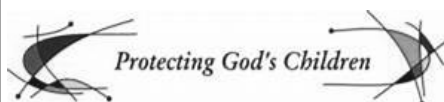
