



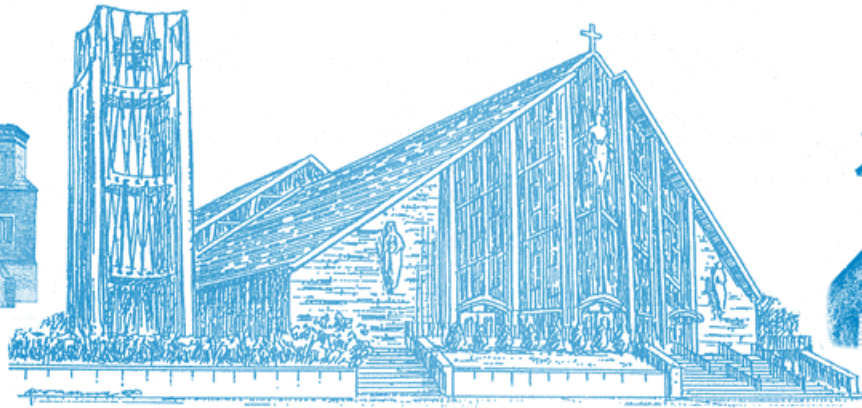

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

4th Sunday in Lent B-2018

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!



All three readings today bear witness to what the Ephesians passage calls God's generous mercy. The words, *when we were dead through our sins, He brought us to life with Christ*, speak of God's action in transforming humans. The letter is short on detail, but the First Reading, from the Second Book of Chronicles, provides us with plenty. The two books of Chronicles fit rarely in our

Sunday and feast day liturgies; there is one passage apiece from these two books. The passage describes the successive infidelities of the Israelites, from the heads of the priesthood to the most ordinary people, until there was nothing to distinguish them from other nations. It was only a matter of time before the Temple was destroyed and the people taken into exile. It all looked hopeless until God took the initiative and restored His people to new life with a reconstructed Temple. The real surprise, however, was that God's chosen agent in this was a Gentile, King Cyrus of Persia.

The Ephesians' argument may be difficult to digest because the Chronicles' story may appear remote and set in a past which we can scarcely see, but Jesus' words are neither remote nor dense. Jesus likened His own lifting up to Moses' lifting up the bronze serpent and said that anyone who believes in Him may have eternal life; and then He drops the bombshell by saying, "God sent His Son into the world not to condemn the world but so that, through Him, the world would be saved."

God's purpose is revealed: to save, not destroy, the world. We must be careful about the phrase, "God sent His Son." This cannot mean that God commanded His Son to die a horrible death. We might ask what kind of God would do this. The Gospel, however, does not say that the *Father* sent His Son. Rather, it says, "*God* sent His Son." The Son is God, the Father is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. Therefore, the phrase, *God sent* is the collective commitment of the humanity that God - - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - - made to enter the existence as God in human form. Hence, Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary, is the visible expression of God who saves the world.

Although Lent is often thought of as a mournful season, it can be a season of joy as well. Today's readings make it clear why this is so. It is about reflecting more and more deeply on God's infinite love, directed at our salvation, at our living the life of God to its fullest. Now that's a cause for joy. It is, of course, a season of penance. This, too, can be something positive. We do not try to win God's favor or persuade God that we deserve God's love because we can never deserve God's love. Our Lenten penances can draw us more fully into the mystery of God's love. We can be positively bursting with joy at the thought that God, Father, Son and Spirit, loves us so much that God is prepared to go to such great lengths to give us life.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2018 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. On a day of **Fast**, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and **two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity**. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
2. On a day of **Abstinence (Fridays during Lent)**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling Easter Duty* extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 27.**

***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*
