



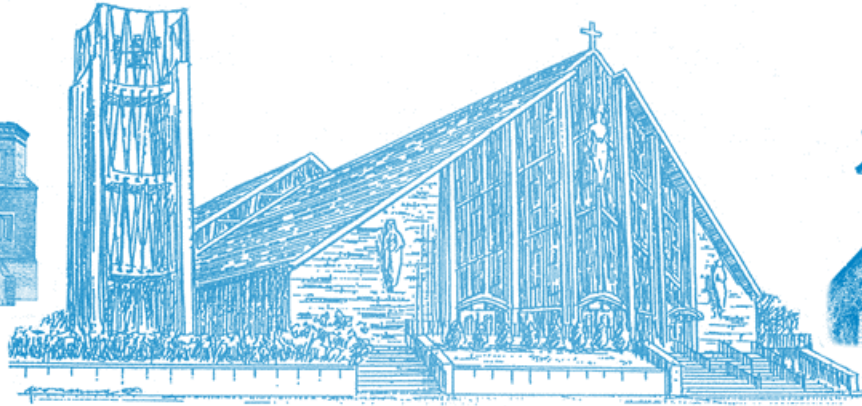

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

5th Sunday in Lent B-2018

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Jeremiah's passage begins with the words, "See the days are coming..." and the second reading of the letter to the Hebrews speaks of how Jesus is looking beyond His life on earth and, in the Gospel, Jesus says *the hour has come*. When you think about it, we still live in that "hour"; it is still unfolding in our lives. Even though it is true that He has died and risen again already, to live in Christ is to live in His death as well as His rising to new life. Our lives are full of small deaths and small resurrections. When we confess our sins, we join with Jesus in His Eucharist, we make sacrifices and take risks for His sake, then something in us dies and something new is born again. We can live many years without allowing this death and resurrection to take place in our lives. We may not choose to change but sometimes it is outside circumstances which force a change in us. This can be the grace of God for us but only if we have faith and hope.

Each year we are called upon to live in a special way both Christ's death and His resurrection, to prepare us for that paschal moment that will happen in every life. The seed has to stop being a seed if it is going to be what a seed is meant to be. If we live our lives in a perpetual winter and all living memory had forgotten the spring, how shocked we would be when a new spring finally came. We would call it the death of winter, unable to imagine that this was not death but a newness of life. St. Paul tells us that we are to walk in the newness of life. Jesus walked in the greatest darkness possible, the rejection of salvation itself, yet He entered into that darkness and faced up to it with His human emotions, showing us that fear is to be overcome by hope and love.

The art of travel is knowing what to pack but the experienced traveler will always know what to pack. We will gain more from Lent if we see it not just as a temporary giving up of things but rather training in letting go of everything that holds us up on the journey to the kingdom. Jesus teaches us to travel lightly. The more demanding the journey, the steeper the road, the more we have to unburden ourselves.

During the Lenten Season, we can learn about how demanding the journey to eternal happiness can be. It may not be the material things that we are called to let go of, but we may need to let go of the attitudes, emotional binds, compulsions, automatic responses to situations; in short the false sense of self that hides the true self which is being created in Christ. It is now in these last two weeks of Lent that we can consider the magnitude of the journey which Jesus has asked us to pursue. And yet it is not a journey we make on our own; if we look ahead He is there and we follow.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the next two weeks, as we hear of the interior anguish of Jesus, we are led to the Garden of Gethsemane, the scene of a night of suffering, failure, and loss. In Hebrew, the word means "olive press," and it was an olive grove, although only a few trees remain. Olives can't be eaten off the trees, they need to be cured—knocked from the trees at harvest time, scooped into a stone basin, and cracked open by a heavy millstone. The crushing stone weight was itself called a "gethsemane," and once it was lowered onto the olives, oil from the fruit and the inner stone would drip into a groove and flow into jars. The night before his death, Jesus experienced such anguish that scripture says his own blood perspired from him, an image no one who understands olive oil production could miss.



Today, the Mount of Olives is within the city of Jerusalem and the site of the Church of All Nations, also known as the Basilica of the Agony. It was built in 1924, funded by Catholics in twelve different countries. An open-air altar on the grounds is used by Anglicans on Holy Thursday every year. Nearby is the Russian Church of Mary Magdalene, built by the czar in 1888, its magnificent golden domes a distinctive landmark. There is also another tiny Catholic Church, called *Dominus Flevit*, or "The Cry of the Lord," built in a teardrop shape in the mid-1950s. For centuries, the Franciscan order has had the care of the shrines of the Holy Land, and our Good Friday collection helps sustain these precious sites.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2018 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. On a day of **Fast**, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.** Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
 2. On a day of **Abstinence (Fridays during Lent)**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
 4. The time for fulfilling Easter Duty* extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 27.**
- ***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*
