BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

Pastor's Desk**

3rd Sunday in Lent-B-2018

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Thirty years before John wrote today's Gospel, the huge Temple in Jerusalem had been completely destroyed by the Roman army. At one time it had been among the wonders of the ancient world, the most sacred place for the Jews, the place where God dwelt with His people. Now it was little more than a heap of ruins. Yet, for John, it was so much more than an ancient site. He had seen it in its' glory days. Now he was old but, as a young man, he had once visited it with Jesus. It was Passover time and John had witnessed a huge influx of Jews coming from all parts of the Mediterranean world; he had seen the Temple courts being turned into some kind of bazaar, with the transaction of money changers, the noisy haggling of buyers and sellers, the bleating of sheep and the flapping of pigeons' wings.

John could see that Jesus was more than distressed, He was angry. In the next moment, with a whip in His hand, Jesus was clearing them out of the Temple - - men and beasts and birds; He was turning over the tables of the money changers so that the coins went jangling across the stone pavement and explaining why He did so. Jesus bluntly told them: "Stop turning my Father's house into a market." He knew that people needed to make proper preparations for the upcoming Passover sacrifices, animals had to be bought and the right change needed to be acquired but there was no need for them to turn His Father's house into a market place. There were other places where this could be done. Jesus' reaction reminded John and his friends of the prophetic words: "Zeal for your house will devour me."

The Jewish authorities were not happy or amused by this. Their first reaction was to think who this young rabbi from Nazareth thought He was. What sign could He offer them to show what it all meant? And Jesus' reply must have left them bewildered when He said: "Destroy this Sanctuary," (a sanctuary already 46 years in the building) "in three days I will raise it up." But the Jewish leaders were not the only bewildered ones; John also admits that it was only after Jesus' death and resurrection that he realized what Jesus was getting at. It was then that all the pieces fell into place. It was as though on that day in the Temple, Jesus had put His own hand on His own heart when He said: "Destroy this Temple and I will raise it up in three days." Jesus, the living Temple of God, destroyed on Good Friday, will rise up again on Easter morning.

My brothers and sisters, within a few weeks we shall be celebrating the death and resurrection of Jesus; in the risen Jesus we have the new, indestructible, Temple of God. This Temple is not made of stones, however magnificent, but of the glorified flesh of the victorious Christ; this is where God is to be found and where God is to be worshipped in spirit and truth. Perhaps the most extraordinary feature of this new Temple is that it be built of living stones and those living stones are you and I. Together with Christ, our head, we make one body, one Temple to the glory of God. These thoughts may help us to see our Lenten journey in a new light, a way of making us a little more worthy of our dignity as living stones in this new living Temple. At the same time, may they bring home to us the extraordinary privilege that is ours, that is the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, as in every Mass we are empowered, "Through Him, and with Him, and in Him," to give all honor and glory to our Father in heaven.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2018 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. On a day of **Fast**, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.** Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
2. On a day of **Abstinence (Fridays during Lent)**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling Easter Duty* extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 27.**

***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

RECONCILIATION: Friday, 7:00-8:00 PM; Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, March 31, which is Holy Saturday)

On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.

On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross.

The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso of March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, **March 11, 2018.** (this is a change of date)
