



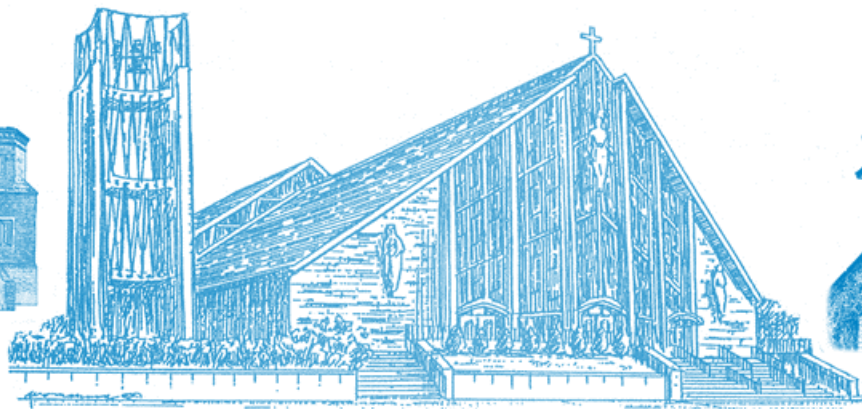

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

At the Easter Vigil, the lighting of the Paschal Candle from the Easter fire is always tricky business. It might rain or a strong wind may blow the fire out. The wick might also burn quickly but not ignite the wax. The heat of the fire makes it difficult but there is always relief when the lightened candle is carried into the safety and protection of the Church. At the procession of servers, there is an awesome beauty of watching the flicker of each candle being lit as the Celebrant comes closer to the Church Sanctuary. A glow moves through the Church building, lighting up the darkness and the warmth of the burning candles touches the hearts of the people

gathered for this celebration of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

This most wonderful night of the year celebrates the newness, transformation, and growth of the Church. From the setting of the sun in the Pacific Islands across to Australia, China, Korea and then through India, through Africa, Europe and going towards the Americas, this special light is spread and the hope of Christ's resurrection has dispelled the fear. Christians who have been persecuted in many nations are renewed and strengthened by the victory of Christ over suffering, death, and evil. The light of each candle offers God's holy people the hope that good will triumph over evil, hope over despair, justice over oppression and peace over division.

As the Church celebrates the baptism of new Christians into the Church and receives other Christians into full communion, we are reminded of the adventure of being a follower of Jesus so that those who believe in Christ and the promise that God so loved the world that He sent His only Son so that those who believe in Him will inherit the promise of eternal life. Just as the fragile light is carried into Church, so it is a reminder that we are called to nurture those people whose faith is faltering and reach out to those who have wandered away from the practice of the faith. We are called to reach out to those in need, not only by words but, more importantly, by our love in action.

Today it is enough for us to realize that we are being asked to accept our call to be faithful witnesses of the resurrection. Now, as heralds of this good news, which even makes Friday of Holy Week *good*, we are proclaiming not only that Christ was brought back to life but that we, too, have been brought back to life with Him. There is a temptation to think that we must wait until our earthly life comes to an end before we will experience this new life. However, it is clear from the writings of Saint Paul that this is not so. We have already been brought back to life and freed from the sin that held us bound. Saint Paul is keen that we set our sights on heavenly things and realize that Christ is our life now.

On behalf of our parish staff, Fr. Mauro, Fr. Francesco and Deacon Anthony, I wish you a ***Happy and Blessed Easter Season, Buona Pasqua, Maligayyang pagkabuhay ni Kristo.***

Jesus tells us that, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these my brothers, you did for me."
