



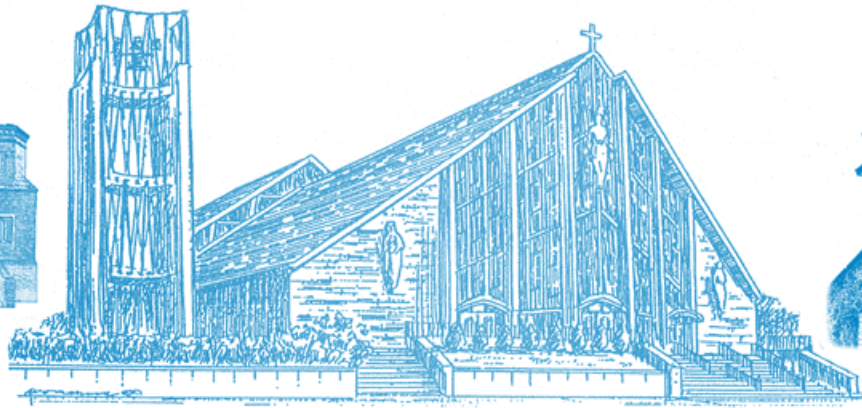

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Often times we are asked to fill in questionnaires or surveys. Some forms have a religious belief section in which you are given a selection of choices. You can click on one of the major religions or indicate that you are an atheist - or you can choose *SBNR*. This has become a popular choice in the last few years and it stands for "Spiritual But Not Religious." It is understandable why many people choose this. They want something spiritual in their life but they don't want to get involved with the controversies and scandals that can be associated with organized religion. They also avoid the effort of having to come to worship.

On the other hand, there are dangers in only being spiritual. People may become very individualistic, with themselves at the center of everything. Or they might get involved with weird ideas about the supernatural without the wisdom of the community to guide them.

We might wonder what our Catholic faith says about this. Well, during the Easter Season we are reading the Acts of the Apostles, which describe what happened at the beginning of the Church. First came Pentecost. You could not have a more spiritual occasion. The Holy Spirit comes with power in wind and fire to each of the apostles. The healing which the Holy Spirit has performed was only possible in the name of Jesus Christ, the one who was crucified and whom God raised from the dead. We might also ask ourselves how we share in the power of the risen Christ. Peter did not tell the crowds at Pentecost just to enjoy themselves and let the Spirit take over. No, he told them that they must be baptized. They must become a member of the body of Christ and join a community, church.

Our Christian faith tells us that we are saved as individuals, but as part of a people or community after baptism, the early Christians shared their possessions with each other and broke bread together. It was a religious group. Being alone and spiritual is not defense enough to withstand those powers that tried to destroy Jesus. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are called to be part of His flock. At the heart of this flock, this community, is a God who shows His face in Jesus the Good Shepherd. He respects our freedom and nourishes and cares for us. He is willing to lay down His life for us when the wolf comes to attack. The hireling lets the sheep scatter because he is only interested in payment. Jesus however, will sacrifice His own life in order to bring His sheep together.

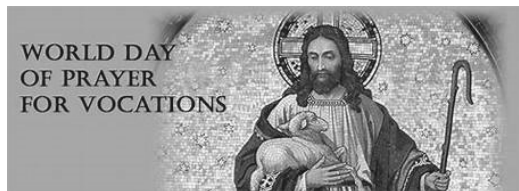
It is interesting to note in our society that even some atheists want religion. A popular philosopher, Alain de Botton, has written a book called Religion for Atheists. He sees good in religious rituals that bind people together in a fragmented society. He even suggests a new kind of restaurant in which atheists could have meals together, with a "book of Agape" on hand from which to read (*agape* is the New Testament Greek word for *love*). But this, of course, is what we have each time we come to Mass, when we receive the divine words of Scripture and the real presence of Jesus in sacramental food. Together we are part of the body of Christ. We are called to bear witness to that divine love of Christ in the way we care for one another, especially when it challenges us in our individual selfishness. We could ask ourselves whether we imitate Christ in our pastoral care for our neighbors. Are we truly good shepherds to our family and friends?

Religion has many weaknesses and is in constant need of reform, but we need it to give our spirituality a push in the right direction towards justice and charity in order to prevent it from becoming too self-centered. The spiritual need the wisdom of religion to stay close to Christ the Good Shepherd. We might listen to words of St. James in what he writes in his letter. There he talks about down-to-earth religion. He says: "Pure, unspoiled religion, in the eyes of God our Father is this: coming to the help of orphans and widows when they need it, and keeping oneself uncontaminated by the world".

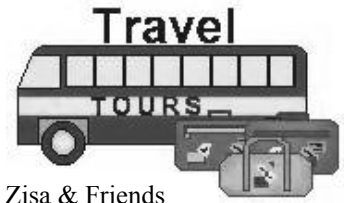


