



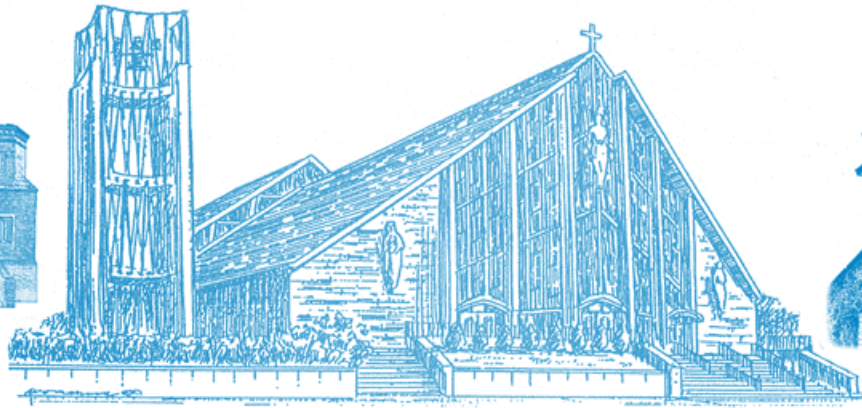

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

5th Sunday in Easter B-2018

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we congratulate our children who received their First Holy Communion yesterday. This year we had a large class numbering ninety. We are grateful to our Director of Religious Education, Sr. Patricia, to Sr. Jane, our Principal of GSA, and our teachers who, together with the parents, have nurtured these children in preparation of receiving the Holy Eucharist, the real Presence of Jesus, for the first time. Jesus emphasizes today of how the vine needs to be carefully tended; today is only the beginning, the nurturing needs to continue as these children need to learn more about their faith in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in a few years. May God bless you!

The Scriptures today tell us that the traditional grapevine is one of the world's most important agricultural crops. During the time of Jesus, vineyards were everywhere and practices relating to their cultivation would be familiar. In today's Gospel Jesus emphasizes that a vine needs to be carefully tended and that it has a living and connected structure. The vine produces fruit through the branches and the branches are dependent on the central vine.

Jesus describes Himself as the *true vine* and says, "My Father is the vinedresser." The motif of the grapevine is present in a great deal of Christian art as a metaphor of the ongoing presence of Jesus. On the mosaic floors of churches of the Byzantine period in the Holy Land and its vicinity, the grape is often seen as the symbol of Jesus. The love and connection between God, Jesus and our community, is described in John's Gospel using the image of the vine and branches. Jesus tells us that "You are the branches," and we will bear "fruit in plenty" if we remain in Him. The organic unity suggests a community of many people who are sharers in a single life. Union with Christ is a condition of fruitfulness. Being followers of Jesus gives our lives meaning and direction. Fruit is possible only if we are in union with Him, for He is the productive source of it all.

Our opportunity of bearing any fruit worthy of our natures and of God's purpose concerning us, is by vital union with Jesus Christ. If we do not have that, there may be plenty of activity and mountains of work in our lives, but there will be no lasting fruit. The next time you eat a grape and savor its flavor, you might reflect upon the fruits that we share in our lives because of our relationship with God. The Christian faith is an experience of being in a relationship to God, to each other, and to all of our family and friends. Caring and love bind us all together. You might reflect on the growth you have seen in your own life as the fullness of Christ's promise of that connection and love. And remember also during this Easter Season, that the resurrection fuels and nurtures our growth, hope and love.

Now is the time to open your hearts to Christ and let His life and His Spirit come into you. Through our prayer today we are strengthened in our belief that Christ is the Vine and we are the branches. Through the strength of God's love for us and God's relationship with us, we are able to produce fruit. Our fruits will be in working for the common good and in caring for each other, creation and the wider world. Over the course of this week we may be praying with or tending to an elderly and frail relative or we may be teaching children gardening skills and care of the environment, or we might be supporting a charity reaching out to vulnerable people. When we reflect upon these things, they are truly all fruits of the true vine.

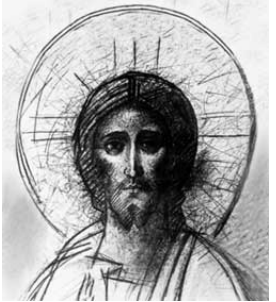

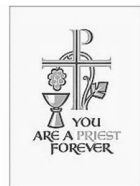
