



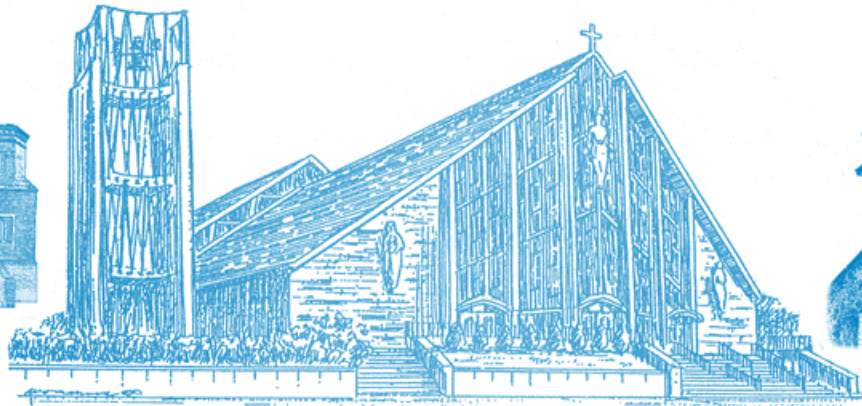

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

We will never know how many lives have been transformed by the action of the Holy Spirit but remarkable things have happened to the lives of many people, down through the ages, starting with the disciples of Jesus at Pentecost. We can think of the experience of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Ignatius of Loyola, both wealthy young men who dreamed of glory on the battlefield. Instead, the Holy Spirit was able to help them to discover their true vocation in the service of Christ, to rebuild and renew the Church. Their lives had been formed by social expectations of their times to find happiness through the things their money could buy. But God had other plans and ideas for them.

Mother Teresa (St. Teresa of Calcutta) had another experience. She thought that she could do God's will as a teaching Sister of Loreto until she experienced the poor people dying on the streets of the city outside the safe confines of the convent walls. Again, God had other plans for her as she left the security of her religious house to found the Missionaries of Charity, devoted to the care of the poorest of poor.

The disciples, too, were on a steep learning curve. Their expectations as followers of Jesus kept changing. Through the early days of basking in the glory of Jesus, the popular preacher and miracle worker, through the despair of the passion and death of their Lord, they found themselves driven by the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Good News to the whole of Creation. But they had no plan, no instruction manual. They discovered that they were sent not just to announce the coming of the Messiah to the Jews but that the Gospel message was for everyone. The Holy Spirit made it clear that the faith in Jesus was possible for anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right. They came to understand that what Jesus wanted was a community of people who loved one another. This was the way they would experience God, rather than in rituals of the Jewish Law. They knew that the risen Lord was living among them as they reached out in love not only to one another but especially to those in need. Saint John, the beloved disciple, reflected for years on the life and teaching of Jesus and summed it up in his Gospel and letters. He tells us that God is love and what God wants for us is to live in love just as Jesus has shown us, by loving one another. In this way we will share in the joy of God. The whole message of the Scripture is to be found here; love one another as I have loved you. This is the mission Jesus gives to His disciples, as His chosen friends, they are to go out and bear fruit that will last.

In these weeks after Easter, we relive with the disciples their growing awareness of how the risen Lord continued to be with them; how He shared His Holy Spirit with them to help them understand all that Jesus had taught them. We discover with them that Jesus calls us in our turn to be His friends and to know His love for us. Jesus wants us to continue His mission by bringing His love and peace to the people of our own day. We recall what an unlikely bunch of characters Jesus chose to carry on His work. They were transformed by the Holy Spirit. Their old ideas had to change. They had to let go of their prejudices and fears and allow God to use them to build the Church, a community of love and service for all people, especially the poor. It is the same for us, we are ordinary people, struggling with our own lives, our fears, our weaknesses, but we believe. We believe that Jesus continues to be present in the world in us. We believe that He uses us to bring His mercy and love to the world.

This Thursday we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, a holy day of obligation and next Sunday we will celebrate Mother's Day.

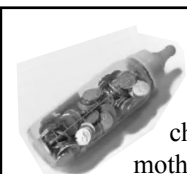

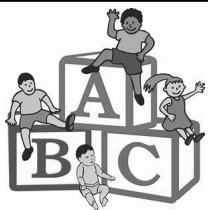
