



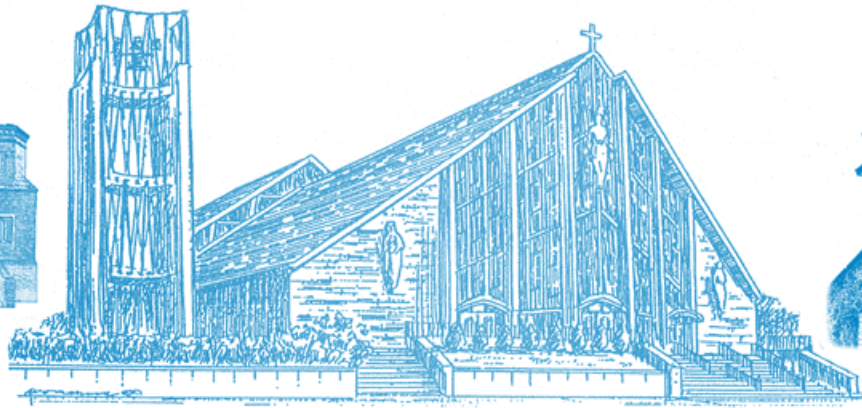

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

A Message from Fr. Mauro...

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 2018

My Brothers & Sisters in the Lord!

This Sunday's Gospel continues the discourse of Jesus with the crowd about bread. So far, He has led the crowd to look for that bread that does not perish, which is Him. The manna, like every gift, is a sign of that bread that God wants to give to everyone: the life of the Son, who makes us sons. But the crowd does not accept that He can be the bread descended from heaven which gives eternal life. They do not recognize His divine origin because He is a man, like everyone else. Jesus reveals then that life comes to us from His humanity, from His flesh offered for the life of the world. It is the total gift of self that God gives to man. In fact, Jesus is the Word that has become flesh, because in Him every flesh finds the Word.

The terms *meat, flesh and blood* replace the metaphor of bread. *Eating, chewing and drinking*, replace the verb to believe. Believing in Jesus, living bread is eating and chewing His flesh, drinking His blood. Eating not only keeps us alive; the function of the umbilical cord is replaced first by sucking and then by chewing but, even more profoundly, it is an act of communion between the giver and the recipient. What distinguishes human and animal eating is its being a communication of interpersonal love, which culminates in the word exchanged with the other. "Not only milk lives the child, but every word that comes from the mouth of the mother," said someone paraphrasing the biblical saying: *not only bread lives on man, but what comes out of the mouth of the Lord*. Eat meat and drink blood - chew and drink Him! It is a very raw and harsh language. But what it means is even more surprising: to eat the Son of man means to assimilate the Son of God, to the point of living with Him. Eating is in fact taking, putting in and assimilating food. Believing in Jesus, adhering to Him and loving Him, here is called "eating." Man becomes what he eats, or better, what he loves. The Son of God has loved us to be devoured by His love for us and to become the Son of man raised up; we, loving and eating Him, become children of God.

Thanks go out to those of you who have already committed to automated giving, and thanks to those who will now consider this vital effort in our ongoing efforts to continually improve the financial condition of *your* Parish. Again, electronic giving is a proven way to increase and stabilize our monthly income that comes at **NO COST** to parishioners but saves Holy Family valuable time and money on administrative tasks and switching to ParishGiving nets more money back to our parish than the previous electronic giving company we were using.

For those parishioners who are currently utilizing electronic giving, since we are discontinuing our use of our current provider, changing to ParishGiving is mandatory, so we've tried to make the transition as seamless as possible. First, go to our website (www.holyfamilynutley.org) and click on the link to ParishGiving. You can then establish your account and set up your annual donations in a matter of minutes. Then sign into your account on WeShare (LPI) and print out all your year-to-date donations for 2018 tax filing purposes as ParishGiving can only provide a statement for donations made through them. At that point, call LPI at 800-950-9952 and tell them to cancel your donations going forward and **e-mail a confirmation of the cancellation to you**. And that's it - - you're good to go! For those new to the service, simply click on the link on the website and establish your account. It's that easy.

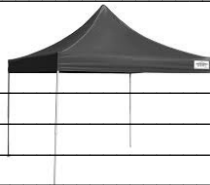
