**BEYOND THE TESTS AND TRIALS OF THE MOMENT
HOMILY FOR THE 25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B)

Some time ago, a cousin called to tell me about a confusing situation that required him to make a quick decision. A medical diagnosis of his son indicated a malignant meningioma which is a delicate brain tumor and the doctors were considering a brain surgery with a 55% chance of survival for the nine-year-old boy. I could hear him crying and asking God, "Why would you allow me to pass through this test?" "There you go!" I interrupted him. "You are passing through a test; you are not stuck in it. Take the 55% chance, sign the medical papers and God will make it a 100% chance!" I could hear him say a strong "Amen" to my exhortation which sounded like a prayer.

Long story cut short, sometime after the surgery he came to visit with the little boy and nobody could guess that he was the little boy with the critical brain tumor. The test became a testimony; the sighs turned to smiles.

Have you ever found yourself in a precarious situation where there seem to be no better alternatives? Have you been in a case where it appears that the whole world would be crashing upon your head and nothing could potentially serve as a remedy? Have you ever passed through a devastating test or trial? Abraham went through an intense trial that tested his patience with God. The same goes for Job who lost all his children and investments in one day. What is your story?

In the First Reading today (Wisdom 2:12, 17-20), we read about the plot by the wicked to beset the just one, that is the innocent person. The reason is only that he is good and would not support evil. One thing that comes out very well in the plot is the plan to PUT HIM TO THE TEST and TRY HIS PATIENCE.

In life, we often face a lot of things that come around to put us to the test and try our patience. They come through various people and events in our lives. "How do you react to the tests and trials in your life?" Often, we complain and blame everyone, including God, and forget one crucial thing; putting our trust in God. Even the plotters against the innocent confirmed in the First Reading that he believes that God will take care of him.

Individually, we have our respective narratives of trials and tests and, more significantly, the Church at this moment is going through her season of tests and trials with all the issues connected to moral relapse and sex abuse of minors. It is essential for us to know that it is our testing and trial, not just for the priests and the church hierarchy, because the Church is not just the clergy but also for the laity.

For every trial, we need to be patient and put our total trust in God, not on our understanding (Prov. 3:5). And like every test or trial there would always be an end much as we rely on God to uphold our lives as the Responsorial Psalm tells us.

The past few days leading to this Sunday have been fascinating for our parish as we celebrate the 27th Annual Italian Festival. The joy we are sharing in this celebration is an indication that the sorrows of our current trials and tests would give way to a joyous moment. And beyond the tests and trials of the moment, the Lord would uphold us. May the transforming prayers of Our Lady of Sorrows bring God's mercy and consolation to our lives. Amen. God bless you!

Hi Cheryl,

I wanted to take this opportunity again to say thank you to you and the wonderful team of individuals who made this weekend possible. I never thought in my life that I would have the type of healing and peace that this weekend brought me. I feel like this is just the beginning of my healing, but that I am now on the right path.

I also never thought that my story could resonate with others. Several individuals on the retreat spoke to me about how my story affected them. That meant so much to me. I also feel so much validation for my feelings that I previously felt were wrong because they were from my perspective and my personal hurt. I also want you to please, please relay the following message to Father Kelly and Father Jason.

In this difficult climate of priest scandal, where priests in general are vilified, I want them to know how much I appreciated them this weekend. On the way home, I was on the phone with a friend who went to church with her parents yesterday and said how disappointed she was at the homily and how she didn't think she could go back to church because of her feelings towards priests. I told her about Father Kelly and Father Jason and how she shouldn't lump priests all together. I understand the betrayal and the concealment and know how damaging it is - it's the essence of our retreat- however, I told her about the amazing work these men did this weekend in an arena where men in general are many times not welcome. I thanked Father Kelly for his homily yesterday and I thank the priests at my own church after mass when their homilies touch me. Please let anyone who needs to hear this message know how important their role is in this retreat. It wouldn't be the same without them. Just like I told you about my writing to thank my doctor after my boys' delivery, and knowing that the we hear so much bad news about the church, please let someone hear the good news too.

I know this is not goodbye and I'm so glad that I chose to attend this retreat in the Archdiocese of Newark. There is definitely a connection now, it feels like home, and I feel truly blessed to have met you all. God's plan and timing is better than we can ever predict or imagine. Like Father Kelly said, we just have to get out of His way.

We have tried to make the transition as seamless as possible. First, go to our website (www.holyfamilynutley.org) and click on the link to ParishGiving. You can then establish your account and set up your annual donations in a matter of minutes. Then sign into your account on WeShare and print out all your year-to-date donations for 2018 tax filing purposes as ParishGiving can only provide a statement for donations made through them. At that point, call WeShare at 800-950-9952 and tell them to cancel your donations going forward and **e-mail a confirmation of the cancellation to you.** And that's it - - you're good to go! For those new to the service, simply click on the link on the website and establish your account. It's that easy.
