



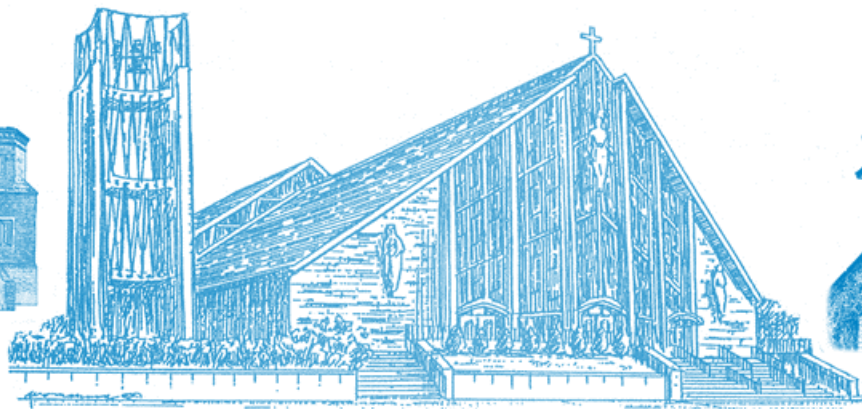

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

**EVANGELIZING OUR EARS AND MOUTHS  
HOMILY FOR THE 23<sup>RD</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year B)  
Rev. Fr. Boniface N. Anusiem Ph.D.**

I was at the entrance of a Church one day, exchanging greetings with people after the mass, when an older woman walked up to me looking apologetic. While holding my hand in the manner of salutation, she told me, in a rather thunderous voice, that she thought I gave a beautiful homily but could not hear anything because she had completely lost the ability to hear. I could not respond to her because she would not hear me, so I kept nodding with empathetic affirmation until she said goodbye and left.

A world without ears and mouths is unimaginable. In fact, that would change the whole dynamic of communication and comprehension. Hearing, speaking, seeing and walking, are essential to life that those who do not have them are considered to have an impairment or disability. In the First Reading (Isaiah 35:4-7a), we hear the oracle of the prophet declaring God's promise of restoration and recompense to those who are suffering from these misfortunes.

In the Gospel Reading (Mark 7:31-37), our Lord Jesus Christ heals a deaf man who had a speech impediment. The connection between the First Reading and the Gospel Reading is the same as the connection between a promise and its fulfillment. At the beginning of His ministry, we heard our Lord Jesus Christ declaring His manifesto when He said, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Luke 4:18-19).

Beyond the physical healing of the deaf and mute in the Gospel Reading, our Lord desires the evangelization of our ears and our mouths. We heard in the narrative that before healing the deaf and dumb man, Jesus takes him away from the crowd. The *crowd* stands for all the distracting elements around us that hinder us from hearing the word of God and speaking forth about the power and glory of God. Many of us are suffering the overwhelming sway of the crowd with all the noise in the world from both the social and conventional media. Consequently, we are losing our ears and our voices.

There is the need for us to allow the Lord to take us away from the crowd so that we can experience the special touch that would transform us to become committed hearers and to proclaim His name. Coming to the church today could be your unique opportunity to disconnect from the crowd and may you also allow the Lord to touch your ears with His words in the liturgy of the word and your mouth with His body and blood in the sacrament of the Eucharist. God bless you and have a lovely day!

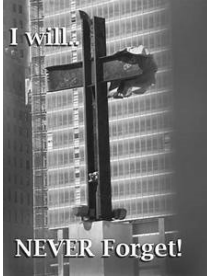

**Parishioners currently utilizing WeShare electronic giving must discontinue using that company and enroll with ParishGiving. This is mandatory.** We have tried to make the transition as seamless as possible. First, go to our website ([www.holyfamilynutley.org](http://www.holyfamilynutley.org)) and click on the link to ParishGiving. You can then establish your account and set up your annual donations in a matter of minutes. Then sign into your account on WeShare and print out all your year-to-date donations for 2018 tax filing purposes as ParishGiving can only provide a statement for donations made through them. At that point, call WeShare at 800-950-9952 and tell them to cancel your donations going forward and **e-mail a confirmation of the cancellation to you**. And that's it - you're good to go! For those new to the service, simply click on the link on the website and establish your account. It's that easy.

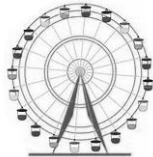

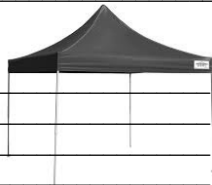
