



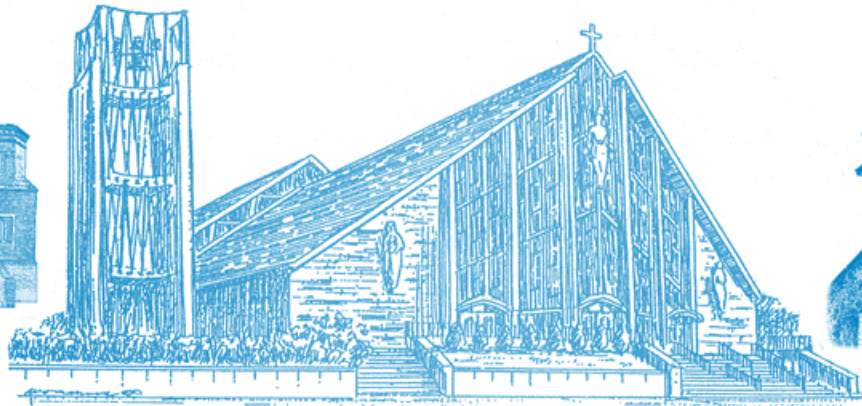

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

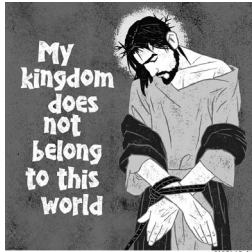

From the Desk of Fr. Francesco...

33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time



My Brothers & Sisters:

For those who like to use big words, I have one for you: **Eschatology**. It means *a study of the last things*. As the year draws to a close, our Scripture readings want us to remember that our world, as we know it, will not continue on forever. God has other plans for us --- to be with Him forever. It is basic common sense that if we are aware of what is ahead, we will be better prepared to deal with it when it comes.

In today's Gospel, Mark tells us the topic came up as the Apostles were admiring the Temple. Jesus prophesied its destruction; then He began speaking of wars and natural disasters and families breaking apart and other tribulations that His people would suffer. The central feature of the end of time will be the return of the Glorified Jesus.

The first reading, from the book of Daniel, says, "They will live forever." Let me repeat that Jesus' return is the key feature of the end of time. Just how soon is the big question. It is vague to urge us to always be ready to meet Jesus. That is a message that bears repeating and so Jesus repeats it in a second parable, a few verses after today's Gospel, when He compares the coming of the Son of man to a man who goes on a long journey. His servants do not know when he might return and he warns his servants that when he returns, he doesn't want to find them goofing off. It is a parable that exhorts us constant vigilance.

There are a couple of things in today's Gospel that really challenge us. Jesus says, "This generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place." Some people interpret "this generation" to mean the Jewish people or the Christians. It certainly reflects the imminence of His coming, or it refers to His coming to each one of us at the time of our death.

Another challenge is Jesus' statement about when He shall return. He says, "Of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son but only the Father." There is no conclusive understanding. Maybe He does know and would not say.

While we are too busy to think about any of this stuff right now and we may have forgotten that Jesus wants us to live in expectation of His return so when He will come, we will meet Him not as a stranger but as our God who loves us and came to save us.

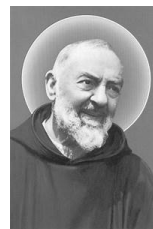
ROSARY ALTAR SOCIETY NEWS...

A Message from Our Social Concerns Committee...



Thanksgiving Weekend (November 22 – November 25): The Committee reminds you that we will be holding our parish food drive for the Food Pantry. We can use: cereal, boxed milk, coffee, tuna, soup, canned tomatoes and vegetables, tomato sauce, canned pastas, mac and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, crackers, treats for children, rice, pancake mix and syrup, mayonnaise, fruit juice. Join us in bringing our offerings to the altar. Bring your offering to church on Thanksgiving Day, or to the weekend masses. Help your neighbors and the Food Pantry.

The Giving Tree will be put up November 17th. Celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by remembering those less fortunate this year. Gifts are requested for local groups, including Nutley Special Young Adults, the retired sisters at Villa Walsh, single moms and babies, and area children in need. To make the project a success, remember the following ground rules:

- Each year, some tags are taken but the gifts are not returned in time. Please help us so that no one has to be disappointed at Christmas by being left out. If you take a tag, return the gift by the deadline of December 11.
- Gifts are often distributed at organizations' parties. We are asking for gifts to be returned by December 11 in order to arrange for them to be picked up and distributed before Christmas. If you wait too long to return your gift, it probably won't get to the person wishing for it. (If you're dropping a gift off on Christmas Eve, it's too late for this year.)
- Some folks like to leave "extra" gifts under the tree, without a particular gift tag. We welcome these gifts, but help us by identifying what's inside the box. Tell us if it's a toy or clothing, for a boy or girl, man or woman, size or age, and item. We hate to open a pretty box just to confirm who should get the gift inside.
- No need to put bows or ribbons on the gifts. Just attach the gift tag from the tree (or a description on your own tags) so we know where to return the gift.
- **If you are answering a request for a gift card or stamps or some other small item, box or bag the gift as envelopes can be too easily mislaid.**
- Spend only what your means allow, but no more than \$25 should be spent on any gift.

Parishioners currently utilizing WeShare electronic giving must discontinue using that company and enroll with ParishGiving. This is mandatory. We have tried to make the transition as seamless as possible. First, go to our website (www.holyfamilynutley.org) and click on the link to ParishGiving. You can then establish your account and set up your annual donations in a matter of minutes. Then sign into your account on WeShare and print out all your year-to-date donations for 2018 tax filing purposes as ParishGiving can only provide a statement for donations made through them. At that point, call WeShare at 800-950-9952 and tell them to cancel your donations going forward and **e-mail a confirmation of the cancellation to you.** And that's it - - you're good to go! For those new to the service, simply click on the link on the website and establish your account. It's that easy.
