MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we hear the prophetic words of John the Baptist. They are words of judgment yet we are told he announced the “Good News.” We might ask ourselves how judgment can be good news. Last Sunday, John was introduced as one who preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He wants people to change but they are reluctant. They want to stay as they are, undisturbed. But John has been sent there to prepare the people for the coming of the Lord who will bring salvation. He warns them of the judgment to come and their consciences are touched. They ask him what they must do.

It is especially in St. Luke’s Gospel that Jesus links salvation to what we do with our possessions. Many of Jesus’ parables warn of the dangers of riches and the accumulation of possessions. There are the stories of the rich man and Lazarus, or the farmer who hoards and does not share his harvest. John does not tell his listeners that they must produce fruits; he specifies what each group should do in practice. He demands change that is not just superficial but makes them uncomfortable, for they are called to share their food and even their clothing, with those in need. The tax collectors who exploit the people must restrain their greed and act fairly. Soldiers must be satisfied with their pay and not misuse their power to blackmail. John’s words of judgment arouse the people from their complacency and prepare them to receive the good news of salvation which Christ will bring.

Sometimes we may wish that God would just leave us alone and get off our backs. But John the Baptist and the prophets tell us this is the worst thing that God could do. Left to ourselves, we get lost following whatever desire we have for possessions, money or just a comfortable, quiet life. Even though we have plenty, we might be inclined to hoard our possessions and close our hearts to those in need. As John the Baptist noted, there are many people in all kinds of powerful positions who do not mind corrupting themselves for the sake of getting more. But we may also face the challenge of changing even though our lives may be happy and normal. We may be deaf to the call of God to serve in a more demanding way. John the Baptist still points to a deeper freedom beyond the enticement of comfort or possessions, his is a word of judgment which makes us ready to receive Christ. And it is a word of judgment that leads us to the good news of salvation. And this is why today we rejoice, because we know that beyond the pain and inconvenience of change, we can rejoice in Christ’s presence as He comes to us this Christmas. St. Paul said, “Be Happy—the Lord is very near.”

At that point, call WeShare at 800-950-9952 and tell them to cancel your donations going forward and **e-mail a confirmation of the cancellation to you.** And that's it - - you're good to go! For those new to the service, simply click on the link on the website and establish your account. It's that easy.
