

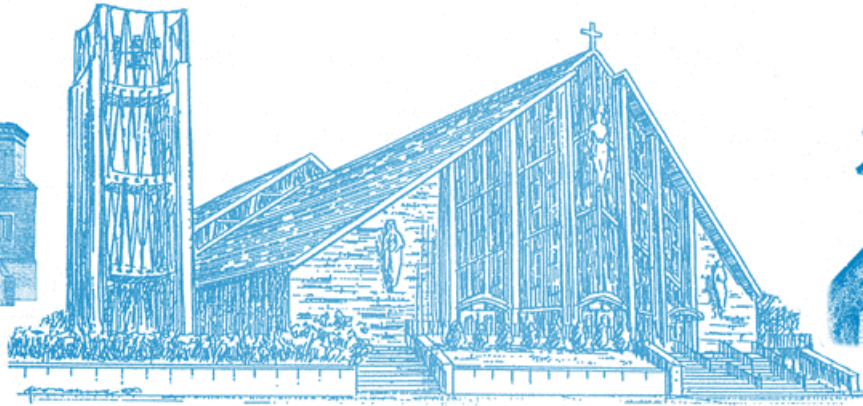

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-986-1690. The priest on duty will return your call.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Saint Jerome, the great biblical scholar, wrote: *“The face is the mirror of the mind, and eyes without speaking confess the secrets of the heart.”* In other words, the face is crucially important because it reveals so much about us. If you were asked which face has attracted you the most, what would you answer? Perhaps it might be the face of a mother or father, a spouse, a child, grandchild or friend. It might be the face of a public icon, some film star or national leader.

We might reflect on what the disciples think they see on the mountain. Jesus takes Peter, James and John with Him and, as He prays, Jesus is transfigured before their eyes. His face changed and it became as brilliant as lightening. It was as though Jesus’ divinity was breaking out through His humanity. Moses and Elijah appear with Him in glory speaking about His exodus which He will accomplish in Jerusalem. The disciples are fearful and Peter bursts out in amazement. Here is glory on the mountain top and Peter wants to do what he thinks is the right thing and have tents or tabernacles where they can all live in glory.

We wonder why Peter behaved this way. We know that a few days before, he had correctly answered Jesus’ question, “Who do you say I am?” and answering that Jesus is the Christ. But then Jesus did make it clear that He, the Christ, must suffer in Jerusalem and then rise in glory. Perhaps now Peter thinks that Jesus’ words are a mistake and what He really meant to promise was this ecstatic moment on the mountain without suffering. I think that is what most of us would prefer to hear. But then the cloud comes and covers them and a voice confirms the words of Jesus: “This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to Him.” They must go down the mountain and follow Jesus on what will be the hard road of trials and suffering. It would be a great temptation to stay on the mountain and construct our own peak moment, spiritually, without the transforming discipline of following Jesus along the road to Jerusalem.

Our faith could have its principal symbol the dazzling face of Jesus on Mount Tabor talking about salvation with Elijah and Moses. But despite our fears, we know that if Christ is to heal humanity He must tackle the evil forces that lie behind the miseries of the world. He must continue His journey to Jerusalem and face the realities of suffering and death. It is not just transfiguration but transformation which heals; not just a face lit up but the profound transformation which will be accomplished after the cross in the resurrection of Easter morning. And in Lent we are invited to follow Him on the same path. We are attracted not only to a face transfigured on the mountain but also to the face abused and covered up with spittle that looks down on us from the cross. As Saint Paul tells us, there is revealed “...the light of the knowledge of God’s Glory, the glory on the face of Christ.”

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Good Friday is a day of both Fast and Abstinence. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

- On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**
- Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
- On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from now until **the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.**

***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year*

RECONCILIATION: Friday, 7:00-8:00 PM; Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Holy Saturday, April 20.)

MORNING PRAYER: Begin each Lenten day with Morning Prayer in the Chapel at 6:00 A.M. (daily through April 17)

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church.

An Hour with Fr. Mauro: Every Wednesday during Lent, 7:00-8:00 PM in the Chapel. Prayers, Blessed Sacrament, Meditation, Rosary & Scripture Reflections

- Every Friday, Exposition of the Eucharist is 9:30 A.M. At 1:30 P.M., there will be Benediction.
- On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.
- First Friday, April 5, with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M.

This is mandatory. We have tried to make the transition as seamless as possible. First, go to our website (www.holyfamilynutley.org) and click on the link to ParishGiving. You can then establish your account and set up your annual donations in a matter of minutes. Then sign into your account on WeShare and print out all your year-to-date donations for 2018 tax filing purposes as ParishGiving can only provide a statement for donations made through them.
